#### **ABRSM 2015**

ABRSM (Associated Board of Royal School of Music) is an international body which aims to support high quality music making, learning and development throughout the world by examining students in the theory of music and practical on any instrument. There are eight grades for which students are eligible to register depending on the strength of the individual. There are two components of the examination - theory and practical - on any instrument of choice.

The IGCSE performance examination, which is one component out of three, requires that candidates' performances must be grade 4 ABRSM standard or above. The TIS Music department thus encourages students to register for ABRSM each year from Pre-IGCSE so







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that by the time they reach Grade 10 they might have at least sat for grade 4. At this week's assembly, students were awarded their certificates from their recent exams.

There is a public holiday on next Thursday and students will appreciate the opportunity to catch up with any outstanding work, as well as preparing for upcoming deadlines.

#### **Personal Modems**
