2016/2017 Calendar Overview

Confirmation of the national elections in December has resulted in a revised calendar for the 2016/2017 academic year. The revised calendar can be found on the school website: http://www.tis.edu.gh/tis-calender/

- Please note that there is no mid-semester break in first semester this year. In lieu, there is a 4-week vacation over Christmas.
- Parents are required to ensure students observe semester dates to satisfy learning requirements. Arriving later and departing prior advised semester dates impact on a student's learning outcomes.

ManageBac

ManageBac (MB) is our learning management portal that is used by teachers for planning assessment, reporting and attendance. Students use it to access assignment tasks, resources, and assessment results, including semester reports. Parents access MB for reports, announcements and can track their child's academic performance. From September, almost all messages will be sent through MB to parents. Next week, parents will be sent an email







invitation to set their password to access their account. More information will be included in next week's Newsletter.

Naviance

Naviance is a college guidance and life career skills software program that students will commence using from G7-12. It will be the platform from which university and college applications will be completed. Students and parents will be able to access this program to ensure transparency throughout the university application process in G12. Within the next fortnight, parents will be sent an email invitation and password to access their account. More information will be included in next week's Newsletter.

Devices

From the start of the 2016/2017 academic year, students in Grades 7-10 will be able to bring one device to school for use in the classroom, under teacher guidance. Devices exclude mobile phones and the preferred device for students is a laptop computer. Students in G11-12 may bring two devices. Parents should note that a device is not mandatory and the choice is the parents' decision. However, a device will provide convenience to students, as all students will be accessing ManageBac (MB) from August, as well as Naviance, a guidance program to support students right through to the submission of their university applications.

- Parents are reminded that students with devices may only log onto the TIS network and not bring their own internet modems to school. For those students using a tablet, parents must ensure the sim card is removed or disabled if the device is cellular.
- Please note that an iWatch is not regarded as a device, as it requires an iPhone for full functionality. However, during any formal examinations, an iWatch must be removed before entering an exam venue.
- My sincere apologies to all new parents for any confusion in the documents received that may have given you a different impression.

SAT, ACT & PSAT Reminders:

There will be SAT & ACT October Registrations early next week, as students have a short window within which they can register.

Test dates are as follows: SAT: October 1, ACT: October 22.

All interested students especially IB1 & IB2s, should remember to see the Guidance Counselors **no later than next Tuesday, 23 August 2016**, to complete registration before close of day. Passport pictures will also need to be taken and payment must be made as part of the registration process.

➤ SAT I Reasoning Test Registration fee: USD110

> SAT II: 1 Subject (USD100), 2 Subjects (USD110), & 3 Subjects (USD120).

➤ ACT Registration fee: USD100

Grade 10 students interested in taking the Preliminary SAT (PSAT) exam scheduled to take place on the **15 October**, which they were informed about last semester, should also see the Guidance Counselor **no later than next Wednesday**, **24 August 2016**, to register. The PSAT is an excellent way for our tenth graders to practice for the real SAT exam, required as part of the application process for most U.S. universities.

➤ PSAT Registration fee: USD30

Please remember that the valid unexpired passport is the only acceptable form of identification for these exams. This is in line with strict directives from the testing agencies (Collegeboard and ACT Inc., USA).
