

Mobile Phones

Students are not allowed to have mobile phones at TIS. Students found with a mobile phone will have it confiscated and the parent can collect it from the Head of Boarding when they are next at TIS.

Examination Sessions and Absences

If a student provides written evidence of illness, or other exceptional circumstances which prevented a student from attending an examination session, the teacher may extend the period of time for completion of the exam, after consultation with the Principal. The duration of the extension is at the discretion of the teacher, with the approval of the head of Department and the relevant Curriculum Coordinator. However, the exam must be conducted on the designated date, as scheduled.

• The student may be given some time to recover and write the exam later, provided the student is isolated from other students who have taken the exam earlier in the day.

• The student may be approved to use a scribe, if there is an injury to the hand that is used in writing.

For approved absences, the teacher will use continuous assessment marks for the reporting period to project a grade for the examination session if the above two measures, are not applicable.

Unapproved absences in any exam session will result in no exam grade. This action will have a significant impact on the overall grade for the subjects for which there is no exam grade.

College visits

Lyndsay Sprado, Relationship Manager from Brock University (Canada) met with our students last Monday. It was an eye opener into education in Canada and the scholarship opportunities available for Ghanaian and international students.

Brock Highlights

- Flexibility, Wide variety: Canadian schools have a wide variety of programs and students are free to change majors at any time
- **Perfect location:** Brock is farthest south near Niagara Falls, residences are connected by tunnels to avoid colder winters, but the winters are mild same area as Spain.
- **Big but small:** Brock is a medium school with 19,000; however ³/₄ of class is done seminar style to allow closer student-faculty interaction.
- **Cheaper:** Canada is a cheaper option for undergraduate studies and the average tuition is about **16,000 USD** (minus living cost)
- **College credit:** IB scores of 5 earn students college credit which can shorten undergraduate duration to 3 years (you can also save a whole year's fees)


