Devices

All students will only be allowed one device at school this year. We recommend a laptop. However, the final decision is the parents. Devices should be kept in a protective sleeve when not in use. Students should not share their devices with their peers. Students must only access the TIS wifi network and personal modems are not allowed. During the evening, devices will be stored overnight to encourage students to enjoy adequate sleep and rest.

Mobile phones are not permitted. International students who arrive with a mobile phone must hand it to Alex Tay on arrival and collect it at the start of a school break.

Returning students will be able to have their device connected to the TIS network tomorrow (Saturday) from 2-5pm in IT Lab 2. This will be the only opportunity over the weekend.

An Exciting Year Ahead

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ManageBac

ManageBac (MB) is our learning management portal that is used by teachers for planning assessments, reporting and attendance. Students use it to access assignment tasks, resources, and assessment results, including semester reports. Parents access MB for reports, announcements and can track their child's academic performance. Almost all messages will be sent through MB to parents. Next week, new parents will be sent an email invitation to set their password to access their account. More information will be included in next week's Newsletter.

Naviance

Naviance is a college guidance and life career skills software program that students will commence using from G7-12. It will be the platform from which university and college applications will be sent. Students and parents will be able to access this program to ensure transparency throughout the university application process min G12. During the coming week, parents will be sent an email invitation and password to access their account. More information will be included in next week's Newsletter.

MYP Corner

Thank God the holiday is over!

I guess some of our students must feel like this. What has it been, 10 weeks? They must have been totally bored by the end and happy to come back to school.

During these weeks of holiday a lot of hard work has been going on to make changes to TIS. One of the main changes is the move from year-group rooms to subject rooms. No longer will teachers move back and forth from one room to another, but it will be the students moving. For me personally a normal situation, which I always practised in all the educational institutions I worked in. For TIS staff and students it will be a mind-set and it will take a short time to adjust.

All the classrooms and offices have been freshly painted using mainly white with one additional colour. The result is a bright and nice welcoming environment. All the subjects now have four rooms they can call theirs and for which they have the responsibility and ownership. For me the latter is most important. Having their own classrooms mean they will have their materials around and they can set it up in the way they feel "at home" and the displays reflect the program and subject of teaching and student work that reflects the learning. It's a win-win situation.

Close to the subject rooms there are shared departmental offices, allowing for more collaboration and students easily know where to find their teachers. In what used to be the DP block one will now find the staff lounge and kitchenette. The old staffroom has been transformed into a new CASSA (Creativity/Action/Service and Service and Action) block, shared with Design and Maker Space.

CAS has always been one of the strong selling-points of TIS with a dedicated team guiding the students. With this new space + the construction that is still going on behind, we will be able to offer an even stronger programme. Design, being a mixture of Product and Digital Design, is a new and exciting addition to the MYP at TIS. As mentioned, it is also earmarked as the Maker Space. Students in Grades 7 & 8 will find a so-called Genius Hour on their timetable. A new concept, which we are going to develop and that I will be explaining more about in the coming weeks.

All in all, a lot of changes, that will benefit the teaching and learning, as well as ensuring the wellbeing of our students.

Rising seniors (DP2s) and juniors (IB1s) considering U.S.A. universities, should register ahead of time. All IB1s are expected to finish writing these tests in DP1. You will observe that **not all SAT tests are available on all test dates**- College Board, has revised their testing schedule and as a school we can accommodate only some selected test dates. - Please note that the Wooster application is still FREE.

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
