Truman State University, U.S.A.

- Number 1 public school in the Midwest, USA
- Small and personal, liberal arts focused public university







- 48 undergraduate majors available in areas such as International Business, Accounting, Economics, Business Administration, Communication, Theatre, Computer Science, Psychology, Creative Writing etcetera.
- Affordable; total fees approx.. U.S.\$29,946 per year
- \$2,000 IB scholarships and other scholarships available, usually up to \$7,000 for international students
- 16:1 Student to faculty ratio
- 90% employed or in graduate school after six months

Kingston University, U.K.

- The school is located in one of safest areas in London
- Internationally focused; wide variety of students
- Have strong hands-on Engineering and Business programmes
- The International Office at Kingston University awards more than £200,000 worth of partial scholarships to international students every year. These scholarships are available to students who are classified with an 'overseas' fee status.
- They offer loyalty bursaries, where eligible international students could get up to 10% discount off tuition fees
- The faculties at Kingston University offer their own range of course-specific scholarships which are available to a variety of overseas and European students


Creative Arts Update

The understanding and grooming of the individual is engaged with and unearthed through ones relationship and engagement with drama.
