Test Preparation

 All IB students are encouraged & urged to use their Christmas vacation wisely to get some much needed rest, study and also prepare for their standardized tests such as SAT & ACT examinations (especially for those considering U.S. universities).
 Consistent personal practice is one of the surest ways to get familiar with the test format and content in order to excel on these aptitude tests.















January SAT Registration

If your child has registered for January SAT all payments should be made in U.S. dollars only. The SAT is \$110.

Ghanaian University Applications

Applications to Ghanaian Universities will commence next year. IB2 students interested in applying should discuss their preferences with their parents over the break, before school resumes in January. There's certainly no place like home!

IB2 College Applications

All IB2 students are reminded to complete all application requests such as transcripts and recommendation letters to their universities with December and January deadlines, before we close for the Christmas break. Based on the timelines we provided earlier, November is the month recommended for all U.S., Canadian and UK university applications.

IB1 College Applications

All IB1 students are reminded to discuss their country of choice with their parents during this vacation. Each student should have a list of at least 5 schools for every country that they are applying to upon their return to school, and this list will be reviewed by their college guidance counselors.

Yale Young Global Scholars Program

All IB1 and grade 10 students who signed up for the Yale young Global Scholars programme taking place next year, are being reminded to visit the website and complete their application essays over the Christmas break. The essays should be emailed to their Counselors and their applications submitted within the first week of re-opening- by Friday, January 13 2017.

Note: a credit card payment is required to submit the application. Also parents interested in financial aid must complete the financial aid application online over the break.


