#### Admissions for 2018/2019

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Admissions for 2018/2019 open tomorrow, 1 December.

It benefits TIS if our admissions process is completed early, by the end of May. The benefit to parents for completing the admission process early is discounted fees at the application and admission stages of the process.

Online aptitude testing will replace the traditional entrance exam. This change has two benefits for students:

- it eliminates any bias for students studying under different school curriculum programs; and
- the test can be completed at TIS at any time convenient to the student (and parents) and TIS.

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#### **G12** Personal Safety and Training

G12 parent, Afotey Odarteifio, proposed this important initiative so that our G12 students are aware of, and ready for the world that awaits them after May 2018. In his words.....

TIS is an international boarding school, a high school which runs the IGCSE and IB Programs. Most of the students pursue their education outside after their programs with the School. Considering the increasing insecurity in the world in the face of terror threats, racial attacks, rape, gun violence, mugging, acid attacks and armed robbery, the need for increased awareness of these threats to life, and ways of mitigating them have become crucial.

The Life Preservation Project by Saber Company Ltd is an initiative to get young people to become aware of the imminent threat in their environment, increase their sensitivity to identifying imminent threat to life and property in their environment, teach them skills on avoidance of threat or confronting threat if need be, and mitigating the impact of any threat to them or to their neighbours.

Saber Company Ltd, a security planning, close combat tactical training, and threat management company, is collaborating with Tema international School to organize its Life Preservation Program for 50 final year students of the School. The program will be conducted over 2 days with students being organized into 2 groups of 25 students per group, and each group being taken through 5 hours of Life Preservation Training per day for the 2 days.

For Day 1, Students will have a chat on environmental threat awareness, and management of physical threat. Day 2 would be more concentrated on various self protection tactics and skills.

It is intended that there will be 2 Breaks during each session to enable participants refresh. The First session should start 07:30hrs and end just before lunch time, and the Second Session would commence after lunch at 1.00pm, and ending by 18:00hrs.

The Lead Instructor for the Program is Grand Master Richard Crabbe De Bordes, an internationally acclaimed close combat tactician and threat management instructor, and CEO of Saber Company Ltd.

At the end of the program it is expected that students will become more sensitive to















identifying prospective dangers in their environment, and they will also be better equipped to confront any physical threat to their life and property.

This program is a Social Outreach Initiative by Saber Company Ltd. TIS is providing the venue for the training of the students, and Saber Company Ltd is providing the Instructors, Training Assistants, equipment and other logistics for the Life Preservation Training.

We are happy about this collaboration, and we hope to see the completing students of TIS not just mentally equipped to confront the challenges of the world, but also tactically enabled to preserve themselves in an increasingly less secure world.

I welcome this initiative and appreciate Afotey Odarteifio's involvement to facilitate this program.

Alumni Week

TIS will celebrate Alumni Week from 8-14 January 2018. During this week, Alumni members will be guest speakers at our first weekly assembly for the new semester, talk and discuss subject and college courses and provide advice to our G10-12 students. These talks and discussions are always highly valued by our students. They will also join the common room meeting to discuss hostel life and coping issues. On Saturday, 13 January, they will be joining us for the annual TIS athletics championships and the following day will join us for the Thanksgiving Service and Leadership Ceremony.

#### **TIS Athletics Carnival**

Our annual TIS Athletics Carnival will be held on Saturday, 13 January 2018, from 8.30am - 1.00pm. Parents, Alumni and Staff will also be competing, so start training now to avoid dodgy hamstrings on the day.

#### **SAT**

TIS opted not to offer the December SAT exam at TIS due to the proximity to the end of semester exams. It is too difficult to focus on competing priorities.

Strategically, G11 students must complete any SAT, or ACT testing requirements, by September 2018. To leave it any later in their second year of their DP adds a layer of conflict that students do not need. During first semester of their second year, G12 students need to complete most internal assessment requirements, as well as college applications. Both of these are extremely time consuming for students. They do not need the added burden of completing SAT or ACT requirements during the same period.















Students and their parents should start planning now to ensure these requirements are finalized by September 2018.

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#### **Student Council Elections**

These elections will determine our senior student council executive for the next 12 months. Vetting of nominations will occur during the week and the ratified leadership nominations will be published on next Friday.

Election manifestos will be held on 8 January and elections will then be conducted over the next three days. The Leadership Induction Service will be held on Sunday, 14 January 2018. I appreciate your support.

#### **SMART Goals**

With the first semester nearly over it is time for our students to look back, reflect and prepare for next semester. By now the teachers know which challenges a student might have, and so do they themselves. Knowing what to work on is one thing, but planning on how to do it is another one.

As there were no assemblies for the last two weeks due to the test weeks in Grades 9-12, I decided to use these two hours to have our Grade 7 & 8 students to look at their targets for next semester. Quite often the only focus will then be the academic goals they want to achieve. "I want at least a 5 in each subject!" or "I want to be the best of the class!". Question then is whether these goals are feasible.

It is of this that I wanted to focus on the goals setting in a different way. In their homerooms, under the guidance of their homeroom advisors they learned about SMART Goals.



#### SMART goals are:

S = Specific

M = Measurable

A = Attainable

R = Relevant, Rigorous, Realistic, and Results Focused

T = Timely and Trackable

Learning how to frame goals as SMART goals and being willing to adjust them to get SMARTer is an important skill that helps every student get off to a better start and have a better school year, this year and into the future.

It's not easy to write SMART goals. This skill takes time to develop, and it's especially important to have in place for students at the secondary level. A goal is an outcome, something that will make a difference as a result of achieving it. It can't be too ambitious to be out of reach, but also not so simple that it does not challenge. A goal has to be realistic with a stretch, requiring effort and focus to achieve it. That's why goals need timeframes and measurable action steps along the way so that we can keep track of progress and make adjustments as necessary.

As stated in the IB mission "The IB aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect" Nicely put but how do we achieve this? One tool to look at is the Learner Profile with its 10 attributes; Inquirers, knowledgeable, thinkers, communicators, principled, open-minded, caring, risk-takers, balanced and reflective.

We asked the students not only to look at the academics but also at the other attributes of the Learner Profile that one could use to improve. To my idea the "best" student is one that has all Learner Profile attributes at heart and actually applies them in the best way possible.

Their SMART goals have been written down in ManageBac so they can reflect on them again at the end of semester 2.

# ALL SAT AND ACT REGISTRATIONS TO BE DONE ONLINE, BEGINNING IN 2018. PAYMENTS TO BE MADE BY PARENTS DIRECTLY ONLINE VIA CREDIT CARD, TO REGISTER THEIR CHILDREN, AHEAD OF REGISTRATION DEADLINES.

Over the years, SAT Registrations have been completed via paper applications. And this entailed a long cumbersome process of having students complete paper registration forms, and then having to post the forms to testing agencies abroad via DHL.

This method of registering students for standardized tests was wrought with several challenges. For instance, the inability of students to access their admission tickets on time, parents having to come all the way to T.I.S. to make payments for these tests ahead of time, typographical errors in spelling of students names and other details on the part of SAT, in transferring information from paper registration, onto the online system amongst others.

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Due to these reasons, in our bid to make the registration process smoother, faster and more convenient, we have decided to switch to an online registration system entirely, for both SAT and ACT registrations, starting January 2018. Manual registrations will no longer be accepted. Students will be required to register online for their test themselves under the supervision of the College Guides, using their credit cards, upload passport-sized pictures, print out and submit their SAT / ACT Admission tickets to be given to their respective counselor, ahead of the prescribed registration deadlines. In lieu of this, parents are advised to get their credit card details ready for payment.

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#### **Summer Programs**

All DP1 students are reminded of the upcoming summer programs. Interested students are expected to see their counselors before they leave to create an account and they are to work on the essays and application over the Christmas break. All these will be reviewed in the first week when school reopens. Students are to submit their essays and complete the

summer program applications no later than <u>January 12, 2018</u> or they won't be allowed to participate. We encourage students to take part in the summer programs as it gives them a firsthand experience of college life and also enriches their college applications. 










#### **CAS & Service in Action updates**






