Follow instructions and complete all details. Best times are available early. We expect your son/daughter to attend these interviews with you. Please note than an interview must not continue after the scheduled time.

If you are unable to book an interview with a specific teacher on 11 January, please arrange a mutually convenient time after 15 January with the teacher.

International parents should email me if seeking a skype meeting with specific teachers after 11 January, so that a mutually convenient time can be arranged. If emailing teachers is more convenient, their email addresses are available on MB.

Note: There should be available times to meet with most teachers if you are unable to go online. However, booked appointments have priority and will run as scheduled. The smooth running of our event relies on all parents keeping to the timetable. Please consider other parents and end on time. If you need more time with a particular teacher, arrange a separate meeting on another day.

Alumni members will be guest speakers at our first weekly assembly for the new semester, talk and discuss subject and college courses and provide advice to our G10-12 students. Admissions for 2018/2019

Admissions for 2018/2019 opened on 1 December.

It benefits TIS if our admissions process is completed early, by the end of May. The benefit to parents for completing the admission process early is discounted fees at the application and admission stages of the process.



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Online aptitude testing will replace the traditional entrance exam. This change has two benefits for students:

- it eliminates any bias for students studying under different school curriculum programs; and
- the test can be completed at TIS at any time convenient to the student (and parents) and TIS.

Consequently, there will be no fixed testing dates. Families should advise Bijoux of suitable dates and times so that the testing can be completed, and you can save some money.














The Yale Young African Scholars (YYAS) Program is a cost-free, intensive academic and residential program designed for high-achieving African secondary school students.
