Exeats

Exeats are required if parents require their son/daughter to depart the school for appointments, family gatherings, etc. Parents should download, complete and email the exeat form from the school website: <https://www.tis.edu.gh/exeat-form/>

Please note:

- Exeat requests must not clash with a school event. Approval from the General Manager will be required in these instances.
- Students will not have exeats approved if they have outstanding work to complete.
- Exeat requests for a weekend should be received by COB Wednesdays.
- Students returning from an exeat on a school day must be in full school uniform, including shoes, not sandals.
- Students should return from an exeat by 5.00pm. Gates are locked at 6.00pm.

ManageBac for Parents

ManageBac (MB) is our learning management portal that is used by teachers for planning assessment, reporting and attendance. Students use it to access assignment tasks, resources, and assessment results, including semester reports. Parents access MB for reports, announcements and can track their child's academic performance. Almost all messages, including the weekly bulletin and monthly newsletter will be sent through MB to parents.

Note: When logging in to MB, always tick the small box under password that states, remember me for 30 days. You do not have to change your password every 30 days. You only change it when you forget it.

International Students: Residence Permit for Non-Ghanaian Students

All non-Ghanaian students require residence permit to be able to attend TIS legally, as per the immigration laws of Ghana. TIS is happy to assist parents in this matter.

Please find below the requirements for this process:

1. A letter to the Principal electing TIS as guardian of the student
2. Copy of Birth Certificate
3. Valid Passport
4. Valid Republic of Ghana – Non-Citizen Card
5. Permit fees plus admin. charges
6. Completion of residence permit form (see below for info needed for this form)
 - 6.1. Overseas address, including telephone number
 - 6.2. Name and address of close relation in Ghana
 - 6.3. Two Passport size photos
 - 6.4. Dates of first and latest arrivals in Ghana

Personal Laptop Requirements

We strongly recommend that students bring and use a laptop at TIS. To ensure a successful connection to the TIS Wifi network, parents and students should be aware of the following basic requirements.

1. PC: Windows Operating system should be domain ready. Mac: Mac OS10.9 or above
2. Microsoft Office (Office 365) installed and activated
3. Anti-virus installed and firewall activated
4. In-built wireless adaptor card installed and tested
5. External wireless adaptor (USB) compatible
6. Chrome or Firefox installed

SAT and ACT

Students intending to attend a university in USA are required to sit for SAT and/or ACT. TIS expects our DP students to complete their SAT/ACT testing requirements by the start of Grade 12. Doing so, minimises the disruption that SAT/ACT causes at a busy time for our G12 who finalise their university applications and complete IAs (internal assessments) at the same time.

Please note that TIS is a registered SAT and ACT Testing Centre. Details for upcoming SAT/ACT exams can always be found in our weekly TIS Bulletins.

Absences

Student absences are marked as A. If a student has an exeat for a medical reason, then a medical certificate or statement is required for the A to be changed to H (health) on MB. These certificates can be emailed to: principal@tis.edu.gh

Commitment: Standards, Expectations, Action and Consequences

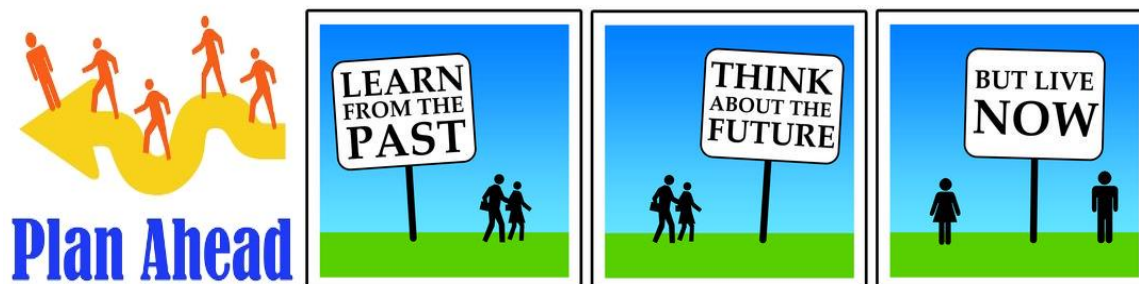
At TIS, we expect students to be balanced, committed to TIS (in terms of being TIS Ambassadors) and demonstrate integrity. Balance requires students to perform to their ability in academics, sport, culture (singing, drama, playing an instrument, school play) and service. We expect students to participate in school events. For example, all students are required to be involved in three ASAs. They are expected to participate in tomorrow's health walk. They are expected to be in attendance for the full mid-term each semester. They are required to fulfil their obligations for hostel clean up.

Unfortunately, there is evidence of excuses for not meeting the above expectations. In not meeting obligations, there are consequences. For example, future participation in any overseas trip will require students to demonstrate their full commitment to TIS. A history of tardiness, non-involvement in ASAs, irregular participation in school events will disqualify students from attending any overseas excursion for that period.

All requirements have a purpose and benefit students in terms of their ultimate goal. We must always ensure we remain focused and always make decisions that support the end goal.

Getting Started! Going to university is one of the best decisions of a lifetime. However, without scholarships, attending some universities can bring great financial stress. Want scholarships? Pay attention to the following.

- Demonstrate a strong progressive track record of outstanding academic performance.
- Be a creative and resourceful individual who has demonstrated community involvement.
- An individual with a strong commitment to becoming a positive agent of change and a

lifelong learner.

- Be actively engaged in co-curricular activities and leadership.
- Demonstration of grit i.e. perseverance, determination, gratitude, emotional and social intelligence, zest among other character strengths. These qualities must be reflected in your essays.
- The university must find you to be a suitable candidate or a good fit for their school
- Specifically look out for universities that will meet your full need.

University Admissions Cycle General Timeline (DP2 Students):

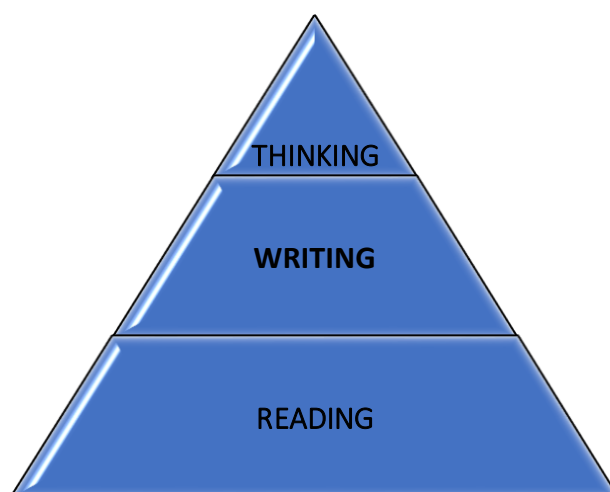
- **Now:** think, read, write, research, plan, and select 10-15 schools for your initial list and narrow down to 10 to 12 universities that meet your academic, financial and personal needs and preferences. Take SAT or ACT at earliest possible date, DP1s take it preferably in DP1 and DP2s, if you must take it again in your final year, take it in October and subject tests in November.
- **August → November 2018:** active application period. Write essays, get transcripts, cultivate teacher recommendations, fill out applications, take all other required tests such as UKCAT/BMAT/LNAT- if required. Complete everything by October- November and **in line with the detailed University Guidance Timelines** which your Counselors have given you. Don't miss your deadlines! No excuses! Give Counselors and Teachers a **minimum of 2 weeks' notice of all university application deadlines.**
- **March → April 2019:** Admission decisions arrive. Renegotiate financial aid where necessary, complete required forms, finalize plans and commit to one school by May 1.
- **April → July 2019:** Prepare for visa application if applicable, participate in Pre-Departure Orientation.

Hb test, Citi FM & TV have offer to support the group with awareness.

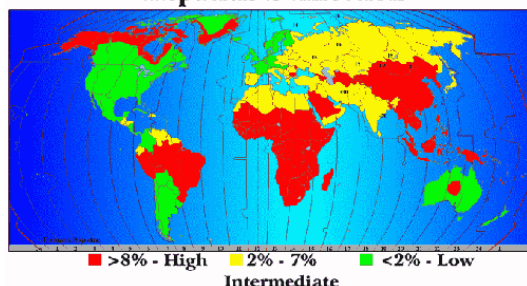

From science under the unit “*Being a scientist*”

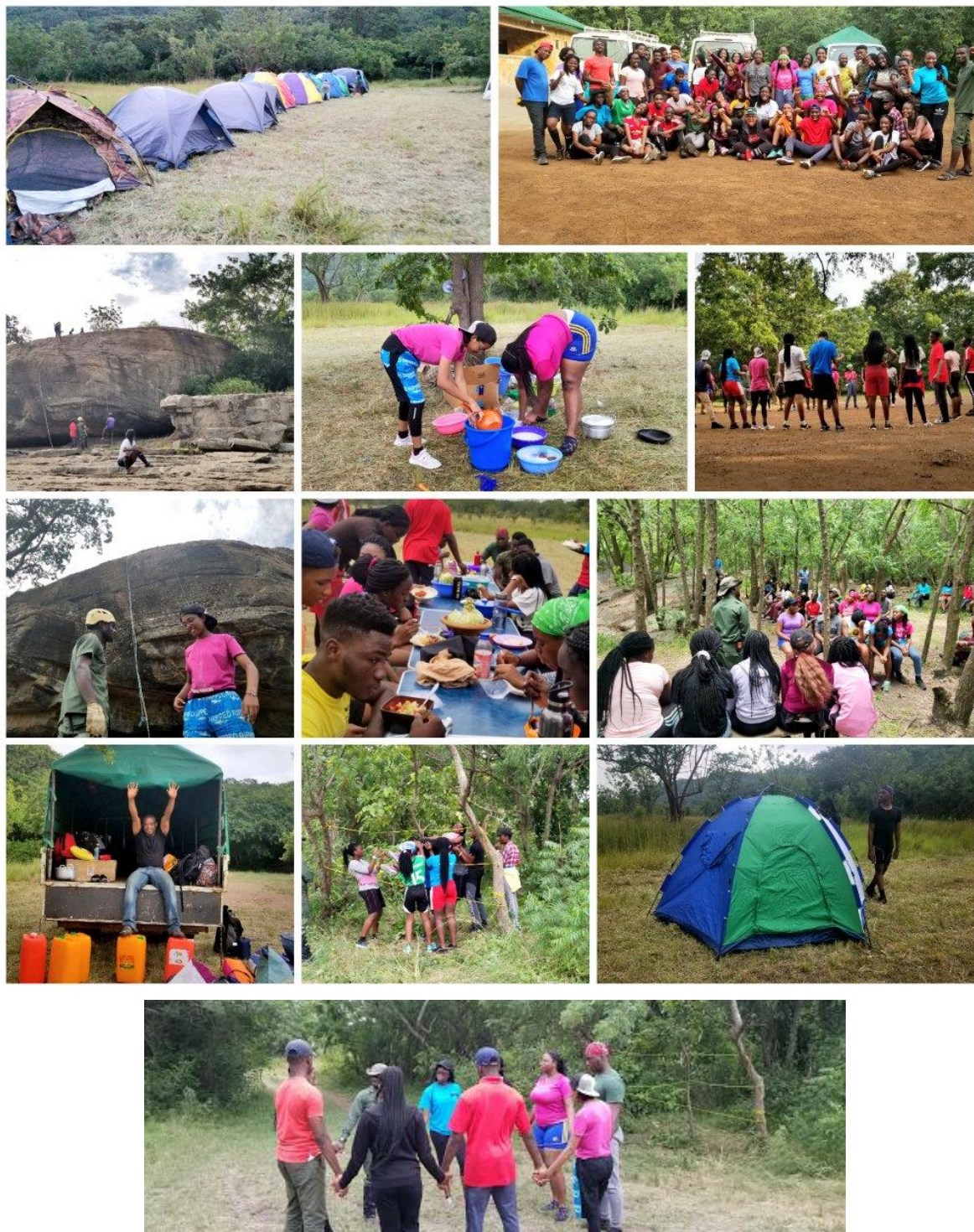

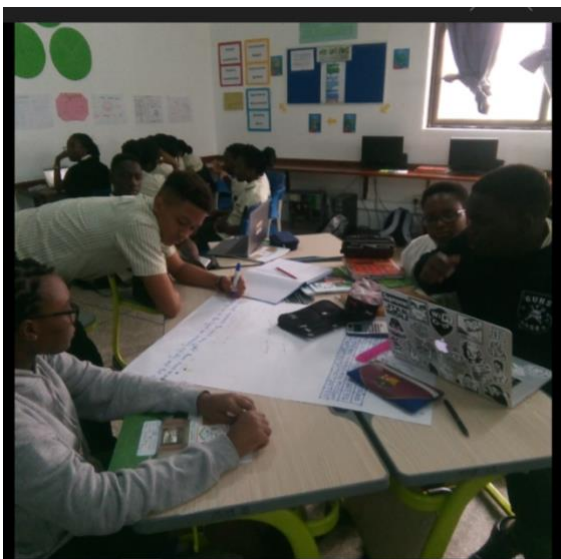
MYP Corner
