#### **Bullying**

#### **Care of Devices**

All students have a personal locker in the classroom block. Students were required to bring a lock to secure their locker, if it did not have an in-built lock.

Students should have a protective cover/bag for their device, and the device should be kept in this cover/bag, when they are moving between classes.

When not using their device in classes, students must secure them in their locker.













When closing the lid on a laptop, students should ensure that there is nothing remaining on the keyboard that can damage the screen. Stapled sheets will quickly crack a screen if the lid is closed on it.

#### **Science Corner**

# DETERMINATION OF THE FOCAL LENGTH OF A LENS INTRODUCTION

The focal length of an optical system is a measure of how strongly the system converges or diverges light. It is the basically the distance over which initially well directed (parallel) light rays are brought to a focus to enable formation of very clear or sharp images, after the light emerges from the lens. A better understanding of this will help the students know some of the working principles of a camera, projector, microscope, binoculars, eyeglasses and other optical systems/materials.

Some Grade 10 students performed an experiment to determine the focal length of some lenses. This was done by varying the position or distance of the given light source (object) until a sharp image was obtained on the screen. The procedure was repeated for five different positions of the light source.

The object distances (u) and their corresponding image distances (v) were recorded in a table and some arithmetic operations were carried out with the data and graphs were plotted accordingly.

#### REFLECTIONS

"What I thought was going to be a normal physics class surely was not. My receptive physics teacher, Mr. Ladson, had prepared a practical session for us to understand the characteristics of light and how it's refracted and emerges from a lens. Mr. Ladson has been organizing various activities for us to be inquirers, but this activity carried out this week was by far the most exciting. I got to see how light bends when it comes in contact with a lens and how that applies to everyday objects such as spectacles and binoculars. Overall, the practical session was very engaging and I was able to grasp information regarding the characteristics of light waves better." **-Eyako Eli Dzantor** 

I walked into the class to see lots of experimental apparatus on the tables. We were about to do an experiment to practically investigate the characteristics of the refraction of light through converging lenses, and I thought, "What a waste of a two-hour period?" We began by learning the theory behind the experiment, then with the help of Mr. Ladson and Mr. Mark, we began the practical. As I followed the instructions and performed the experiment, it clicked and all the miscellaneous pieces of information began to fall into place and I understood everything that was explained, now I can explain the characteristics of an image formed when light is refracted by a convex lens, not because I know it from theory, but because I have confirmed it through experimentation. In a nutshell, this experiment was quite insightful and I hope we have more of them. **-Ethan Pobee** 

In class we experimented on focal points and length. We had setups that demonstrated if the object distance is less than the focal length (the length from the object to the lens), the image will not be seen. If the object distance is greater than the focal length, the image will be closer to the lens. We













were able to relate all our findings to real life scenarios, such as myopia and hypermetropia, where concave ad convex lenses can be used to solve those problems. – **John Adenu-Mensah**






