MYP Authorisation

TIS will have its MYP authorization visit on next Monday and Tuesday. Over the two-day visit, the team leaders will be talking to students, staff and parents, as well as visiting classrooms and observing lessons.

MYP has been an interesting and important journey so far for TIS. Right from the start, I have emphasized the focus is on learning and MYP would make better teachers. It has taken some time, as most teachers and parents only have experience of the 'chew and pour' system of education. However, I am witnessing more exciting classrooms where learning is evident and students are engaged.

Ensuring a continuum for the Diploma Programme, our school exit credential, will benefit our MYP students enormously, as a smooth transition is assured from G10 to G11. Currently, there is a disconnect and students experience a tougher transition due to differences in terminology, subjects, assessment and grading. This disconnect will be eliminated by the MYP.

Following next week's authorization visit, we look forward to strengthening our current MYP practices and preparing for its full implementation in Grade 10 in 2019/2020.

School Stream

In a bid to further improve communication, TIS will launch School Stream over the next few weeks. The aim is to have many aspects of TIS at your fingertips, especially as many are wrapped around a mobile phone.

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

Did you know only limited test dates are available for ACT/SAT? Book your slot with the Counselors' at the top floor of the Learning Centre. DP1s and DP2 this is highly important for scholarships. Take advantage!

DP1s: we keep advising you time and again to register and write the SAT and ACT Tests early in DP1.

There are several benefits and reasons why:

- 1) It gets you more familiar with the test at an early stage.
- 2) You know where to focus on as you prepare for future tests.
- 3) You get to decide early whether ACT or SAT favours you better and you can focus on your preferred test afterwards
- 4) You get to take SAT and ACT, 2-3 times all in DP1 and get the test requirements for your university applications out of the way. That way, you can focus more on DP work such as IAs, EEs in DP2 and not have to be writing these tests in DP2s which can be quite distracting.
- 5) Students in DP2 often regret not taking the SAT/ACT tests earlier in DP1- so learn from their mistakes and take it now.

The end of semester assessments for the IBDP students will start on Nov 27, 2018. Detailed schedule and syllabus focus has been shared with the students, copy of which can be found on managebac.

IBDP Class of 2019 Registration

Over the mid – semester break a draft copy of registration document was sent to students and parents. I had received feedback from most of the parents and students. I will get the final registration attested by the students, a copy of which will be mailed to parents by the students. Parents/ guardians are requested to check on their wards in this regard as any change after Nov 13, 2018 will be at a cost of \$50 (Fifty dollars only) per correction. The same applies to students who move from full diploma to diploma course, decision taken now will have a positive impact on the final result.

















Class of 2019 – Inclusive Access

The IB believes that all candidates must be allowed to take their examinations under conditions that are as fair as possible. Where standard examination conditions and assessment procedures would put candidates at a disadvantage, and would prevent them from being able to demonstrate their skills and knowledge adequately, reasonable forms of access arrangements may be authorized.

Candidates may need access arrangements due to learning support requirements such as:

- · learning disabilities
- specific learning difficulties
- communication and speech difficulties
- autism spectrum disorders
- social, emotional and behavioural challenges
- physical and sensory challenges
- medical and mental health difficulties, including temporary medical conditions (with onset or

occurrence up to three months before IB examinations offered in May/ November)

• additional language learning.

However, access arrangements are not restricted to students with identified challenges. They can be provided to any student who requires support and where the need can be justified based

on the eligibility criteria articulated in the Access and inclusion policy.

If any parent/ guardian feel their ward needs a inclusive arrnagenement, they are advised to contact the IBDP coordinator (dpc@tis.edu.gh) before Nov 13 , 2018 to make the necessary arrangements.

Balance

With so many activities and assessments happening at this juncture, the key learner profile for students now is "Balanced". I am already seeing some being overwhelmed by the tasks at hand, feel free to contact myself or any staff for assistance, remember the work is not difficult but your approach to the work that makes it challenging. Have you heard about the TIS language immersion programme? Find out more.



- This is a three-week language and culture immersion programme, which is designed to motivate students, keep them interested and is based on modern, communication-oriented methods.
- Participants live in pairs with the host families chosen by the organizers Horizons du Monde.
- Participants spend the first two weeks in a chosen region and the last week in Paris/Madrid.
- Participants have lessons for three hours in the morning session of each day and go out in the afternoon to discover the culture and civilization of the French/Spanish people. They visit tourist attractions, markets and supermarkets, museums, they play games and they watch films among others.

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- Participants are chaperoned by teachers of TIS at the ratio of one teacher to 10 students.
- Lessons are delivered by professional French/Spanish teachers.
- > Teachers from TIS live in the coordinator's house and communicate with students in the host families. Together with the coordinator, they get solutions to any problems that may arise from any of the host families.
- TIS teachers, the coordinator and the group's guide wait at a meeting point each morning. The host parents bring the participants in their private cars awaiting to be transported in a coach to school.
- At 5.00pm- 6.00pm each day, host parents wait at the same rendez-vous to take the kids back home.
- Participants spend weekends at home or go out with their host parents.
- Participants are not allowed to go out unaccompanied by host parents or TIS teachers.
- Participants have the telephone numbers of their TIS teachers and that of their host parents. Teachers also have that of all their students.
- Participants have travel and health insurance.
- ➤ On arrival in France/Spain, the TIS leaders collect all passports from participants and give them back to them on the day of departure.
- Parents of our students have access to the addresses of the host families of their children and therefore, can communicate with them and may even visit them should they be in France/Spain whilst the group is there.
- ➤ Parents have the addresses of the TIS leader so they can communicate with him/her.
- Participants are advised to keep their pocket monies with TIS teachers.




