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School Stream

Parents may access it now by downloading the *Schoolstream* app from your relevant app store.

iPhone / iPad iOS

- 1. From your mobile device go to the **App Store**search for **School Stream**
- 2. Tap the **FREE/GET** button to the right of the School Stream listing
- 3. Tap the INSTALL button
- 4. Enter your Apple ID and password & tap OK
- 5. Wait for the install icon to change to **OPEN**
- 6. Tap the **OPEN** button
- 7. You will be prompted to accept push notifications, you will need to select **OK**
- 8. Start typing **Tema International School** into the search then **SELECT Tema International School**

Android / Tablet

- 1. From your mobile device go to the **Play Store**search for **School Stream**
- 2. Tap the School Stream listing
- 3. Tap the **INSTALL** button
- 4. Tap the **ACCEPT** button
- 5. Wait for the app to install then tap the **OPEN**button
- 6. Start typing **Tema International School** into the search then **SELECT Tema International School**
- 7. Tap the **DONE** button in the top left.

ManageBac for Parents

Personal Laptop Requirements


We strongly recommend that students bring and use a laptop at TIS. To ensure a successful connection to the TIS Wifi network, parents and students should be aware of the following basic requirements.

















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































Grade 9 College Guidance Class on researching different universities. Reflection by Nana Ama Boakye:

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

Individuals & Societies Corner

GRADE 12 GEOGRAPHY TRIP REFLECTION

The DP2 Geography students embarked on a trip to the largest slum settlement in Ghana-Sodom and Gomorrah. The students were in the company of their teacher Mr. Michael Odame and a hostel staff, Ms Setor Addih. The trip was to help the students appreciate some of the symptoms of urban stress in less economically developing countries. Feedback from the students indicate that the trip was insightful as it gave them a first-hand experience of life in squatter settlements. We wish to express our gratitude to the management of Tema International School for giving us the opportunity to undertake this trip. We also appreciate the support of the Officer-in-Charge of the Ghana Police Service, old Fadama Station, for giving us five police officers who gladly escorted us through the various sections of the settlement. Please find below some reflections from the students. (*Michael Odame- Geography Teacher*)

For this trip, my grade mates and I went to Sodom and Gomorrah and to Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum. This trip was undertaken to enable us to understand the symptoms of urban stress and to identify the distribution of some primary and secondary tourist sites. At Sodom and Gomorrah, we had the opportunity of walking through the slum settlement and going to the Yam market with police escort. During our stroll, we witnessed symptoms like air and water pollution, crowded and congested housing structures and poor communication lines. Overall, the walk was very informative because even though we started out very skeptical and afraid of the area, we got to learn that some people were only there due to unfortunate circumstances and had nice personalities.

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Our trip to Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum was also very exciting. We were briefed on the life of Dr. Kwame Nkrumah and his impact on Ghanaian society. Aside his tomb and statue, we saw some of his personal possessions like his walking stick, his mattress from his high school and his Cadillac.

All in all, the trip was a huge success. I was able to practise a few of the IB learner profile attributes like being a risk-taker, open-minded, balanced and principled. Through this, I was able to adapt well in these foreign environments and maximize the amount of knowledge I received at the end of the day. *Zara Mingle*

On the 15 of November, our Geography class embarked on a trip to Sodom and Gomorrah and the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum to study symptoms of urban stress and tourism respectively. When we got to Sodom and Gomorrah, we had to get a police escort due to the high crime rates and conflicts in the area. Five police officers escorted us as we toured the area. I noticed that the clustered houses were made out of makeshift materials such as wood and iron sheets. There are no drainage systems in place so the place floods when it rains heavily. Moreover, the roads are unsealed and have a lot of garbage on the sides. After spending about 2 hours walking, we went to the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum. I realized that the place is not as bad as the media houses project it. Visiting Sodom and Gomorrah made me realize how fortunate and blessed I am. I am now more appreciative of my environment. *Joseph Okyere*

We saw very tiny rooms with about 20 to 30 people squishing in, in order to pay small amounts each to cater for their rent. We also learnt about the history of how the settlement came into existence and how the residents benefit from living there. Later on that afternoon, we proceeded to the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum. There, the tour guide gave us a brief history of Dr. Kwame Nkrumah including his accomplishments and impact on Ghanaian society. We saw many artifacts which previously belonged to Dr. Kwame Nkrumah including the casket he was flown to Ghana in, a lot of his clothing and the desk and telephone which he used in his office. We moved on to see his tomb as well as that of his wife Fathia Nkrumah.

Through this experience I have been able to see first-hand what I have learnt in class such as urban stress and resilient cities. Personally, visiting Sodom and Gomorrah highlighted the privileges I have as an individual and has made me more appreciative. *Mercedes Asafo-Agyei*

- Two students will share a room, which contains two beds, two desks, two closets, and an air conditioning unit. **Room selection will be randomly assigned** for cultural exchange in order to **encourage diversity and inter-cultural growth**.
- Each floor of the residence hall has a water fountain and two community bathrooms for the students on that hall (four showers, five toilets, and two sinks in each.)
- Bedding and linens will be provided for each student attending the program.
- Fully-equipped kitchens are available for student access.
- Washing machines and dryers are located in each residence hall and available to students;
 detergent will be provided.
- Hood College maintenance staff cleans community spaces on a daily basis, however they will not be cleaning individual rooms.
- Three meals per day will be provided by the Hood College dining hall which is served buffet style.

















- For each meal, the dining hall offers three main courses (with vegetarian options) to choose from, a salad and soup bar, fresh fruit, and a vast selection of beverages.
 Additionally, a café is available for student use outside of the designated meal plans.
- Students are encouraged to bring cultural talent, dress, instruments, and games/activities for the Cultural Showcase on Monday, 15 July.

The Talent Show is group-oriented and will be hosted on Friday 26, July. Individual talent will be highlighted during the Cultural Showcase on Monday 15, July.

Every year, hundreds of brilliant individuals gather in Johannesburg to take part in the African Leadership Academy Model African Union (ALAMAU) conference. 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Have you heard about the TIS language immersion programme? Find out more.



- This is a three-week language and culture immersion programme, which is designed to motivate students, keep them interested and is based on modern, communication-oriented methods.
- Participants live in pairs with the host families chosen by the organizers Horizons du Monde.
- Participants spend the first two weeks in a chosen region and the last week in Paris/Madrid.
- Participants have lessons for three hours in the morning session of each day and go out in the afternoon to discover the culture and civilization of the French/Spanish people. They visit tourist attractions, markets and supermarkets, museums, they play games and they watch films among others.

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- Participants are chaperoned by teachers of TIS at the ratio of one teacher to 10 students.
- Lessons are delivered by professional French/Spanish teachers.
- > Teachers from TIS live in the coordinator's house and communicate with students in the host families. Together with the coordinator, they get solutions to any problems that may arise from any of the host families.
- > TIS teachers, the coordinator and the group's guide wait at a meeting point each morning. The host parents bring the participants in their private cars awaiting to be transported in a coach to school.
- At 5.00pm- 6.00pm each day, host parents wait at the same rendez-vous to take the kids back home.
- Participants spend weekends at home or go out with their host parents.
- Participants are not allowed to go out unaccompanied by host parents or TIS teachers.
- Participants have the telephone numbers of their TIS teachers and that of their host parents. Teachers also have that of all their students.
- > Participants have travel and health insurance.
- ➤ On arrival in France/Spain, the TIS leaders collect all passports from participants and give them back to them on the day of departure.
- ➤ Parents of our students have access to the addresses of the host families of their children and therefore, can communicate with them and may even visit them should they be in France/Spain whilst the group is there.
- Parents have the addresses of the TIS leader so they can communicate with him/her.
- Participants are advised to keep their pocket monies with TIS teachers.


Why Beauty and the Beast
