Reports

New Admissions for 2019/2020

Admissions for 2018/2019 open tomorrow, 1 December. It benefits TIS if our admissions process is completed early for planning purposes.

Online aptitude testing replaced the traditional entrance exam last year and was appreciated by applicants. This change has two benefits for students:

- it eliminates any bias for students studying under different school curriculum programs; and
- the test can be completed at TIS at any time convenient to the student (and parents) and TIS.

What sort of questions are asked in aptitude tests? The questions look at patterns, relationships, vocabulary and meaning. For example:

- Underline the word that has been misspelt in each sentence.
- Choose the missing word in this sentence from the list.
- What is the next number in this sequence?
- Comprehension questions for a reading passage.

You can't study for an aptitude test. However, you will enjoy it if you are a reader, and you enjoy maths and writing. Reports from the test will be available and identify particular strengths and areas for attention, as well as predicting the likely result for the student in MYP, IG and DP final exams.

Consequently, there will be no fixed testing dates. Families should advise TIS of suitable dates and times so that the testing can be completed.


We strongly recommend that students bring and use a laptop at TIS. To ensure a successful connection to the TIS Wifi network, parents and students should be aware of the following basic requirements.

The Learning Centre @ TIS

In accordance with the school's Academic Honesty Policy and also by way of applying one of the attributes of the IB Learner Profile – to be *Principled*, the Learning Centre has over the past three (3) weeks been engaging students in Grades 7 & 8 in Information Literacy lessons. These lessons are geared towards adequately equipping students to know and appreciate what constitutes credible information, reliable sources of information, the search and location of information, ethical considerations in the use of information and steps that one must take to avoid plagiarism, which constitutes a breach on Academic Honesty.

A number of exercises were administered to students during the lessons to answer them individually while others were answered in groups to foster collaboration (Social Skills) which is a key aspect under the ATLs. Students were introduced to the LC's Online Public Access Catalogue (**OPAC**) to assist them conduct independent searches and also make optimal use of the recommended online resources available to the school community.

Subsequent engagements with students would focus on:

- Research Skills;
- Research Process; and
- Citation & Referencing.

Lessons have been engaging and exciting. We hope to build on these positives to drive our agenda of making our students responsible Media and Information Literates.

MYP Corner

Bringing out the Beauty in every Beast





The Academy
Award-winning
film and one of
Disney's all time
classic stories
was live at the
National Theatre
on Friday, 23

November, 2018. It was a staged adaptation by the "ridiculously talented" Tema International School students who sacrificed a lot to make the TIS @ 15 production a memorable one for the school community and the audience.

The classic story is about: "¹ Belle, a young woman in a provincial town, and the Beast, who is really a young prince trapped under the spell of an enchantress. If the Beast can learn to love and be loved, the curse will end and he will be transformed into his former self. But time is running out. If the Beast does not learn his lesson soon, he and his household will be doomed for all eternity".

There are many lessons that one can learn from this story especially for MYP educators and parents. The MYP is an inclusive, whole-school program which creates opportunities for students aged 11-16 to become life-long learners. It is the ideal program for all students to develop their competencies and capabilities. At the heart of the MYP model (*attached to B&B picture*), is the IB learner profile which describes the attributes that an IB education seeks to develop in students. Next, are the approaches to teaching and learning which are grounded in concepts and contexts and skills which help students learn how to learn respectively. The community project and personal project are platforms for students to apply their knowledge to solving real-life problems. Like the Beast in the classic story who took the opportunity to love and be loved to end the curse, there is an opportunity for every child in the MYP to develop rich skills to be productive and effective in the 21st century and beyond.













Time is indeed running out. Scientific and technological advancement is hitting exponential growth and the earlier we help our students to develop skills for life, the better. Who in the late 20th centuries thought artificial intelligence will become the order of the day in the 21st Century? The world used to consist of 6 continents with challenges in communication. Now it is known as the global village with the help of high-tech communication systems. Obviously, there are no boundaries. It is far easier to reach out to a friend in Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea or Juneau, Alaska – United States of America from Tema – Ghana than it was many decades ago. It is quite clear that we are training our students to fit into jobs that are either non-existent or require more than the knowledge in discrete subjects. The solution to this challenge is to provide our students with an education which helps them to become problem solvers and life-long learners; the IBMYP is the perfect opportunity.

We encourage all parents to continue supporting their children in diverse ways to ensure that they become agents of change. To our educators, the MYP offers opportunity for us to become better educators while facilitating learning which imbibes in our students skills for the future. There is no perfect time to do this than now. Let's all put our shoulders to the wheel.



- Transportation to and from Dulles International Airport/Union Station in Washington, D.C. will be provided by the program.

- Washing machines and dryers are located in each residence hall and available to students;
 detergent will be provided.
- Hood College maintenance staff cleans community spaces on a daily basis, however they will not be cleaning individual rooms.
- Three meals per day will be provided by the Hood College dining hall which is served buffet style.













- For each meal, the dining hall offers three main courses (with vegetarian options) to choose from, a salad and soup bar, fresh fruit, and a vast selection of beverages. Additionally, a café is available for student use outside of the designated meal plans.
- Students are encouraged to bring cultural talent, dress, instruments, and games/activities for the Cultural Showcase on Monday, 15 July.

The Talent Show is group-oriented and will be hosted on Friday 26, July. Individual talent will be highlighted during the Cultural Showcase on Monday 15, July.

Have you heard about the TIS language immersion programme? Find out more.



- This is a three-week language and culture immersion programme, which is designed to motivate students, keep them interested and is based on modern, communication-oriented methods.
- > Participants live in pairs with the host families chosen by the organizers Horizons du Monde.
- Participants spend the first two weeks in a chosen region and the last week in Paris/Madrid.
- ➤ Participants have lessons for three hours in the morning session of each day and go out in the afternoon to discover the culture and civilization of the French/Spanish people. They visit tourist attractions, markets and supermarkets, museums, they play games and they watch films among others.
- Participants are chaperoned by teachers of TIS at the ratio of one teacher to 10 students.
- Lessons are delivered by professional French/Spanish teachers.













- ➤ Teachers from TIS live in the coordinator's house and communicate with students in the host families. Together with the coordinator, they get solutions to any problems that may arise from any of the host families.
- > TIS teachers, the coordinator and the group's guide wait at a meeting point each morning. The host parents bring the participants in their private cars awaiting to be transported in a coach to school.
- ➤ At 5.00pm- 6.00pm each day, host parents wait at the same rendez-vous to take the kids back home.
- Participants spend weekends at home or go out with their host parents.
- Participants are not allowed to go out unaccompanied by host parents or TIS teachers.
- > Participants have the telephone numbers of their TIS teachers and that of their host parents.

 Teachers also have that of all their students.
- > Participants have travel and health insurance.
- > On arrival in France/Spain, the TIS leaders collect all passports from participants and give them back to them on the day of departure.
- ➤ Parents of our students have access to the addresses of the host families of their children and therefore, can communicate with them and may even visit them should they be in France/Spain whilst the group is there.
- ➤ Parents have the addresses of the TIS leader so they can communicate with him/her.
- Participants are advised to keep their pocket monies with TIS teachers.


