Commencing 2020/2021

As confirmed in last week's Bulletin, TIS will commence the new academic year in an online learning mode (Model 1).

Please note the following details in terms of this implementation.

- Secondary classes will commence on 24 August.
- Primary School, including Early Years, classes will commence on 31 August.
- Boarding fees will not be charged for secondary students, until this option is available when schools reopen. This fee will not be charged for students remaining online for various reasons.
- Tuition (school) fees will remain the same for the Primary

SAT 2020

- G12 students who want one more attempt at SAT must sit the SAT test on 29 August. Please ensure you have registered by the due date.
- G11 students wanting to sit their first SAT test will have their opportunity on 26 September. No TIS students will be allowed to sit the SAT test on 3 October (TIS Founders' Day). Start planning now.

School and Secondary School. Please note that tuition fees have not increased in five years, while adding value to what TIS does best has always been a priority. Nevertheless, there has been a reduction in staffing hours to offset increased costs and overheads during this COVID era.

- For our Newbies, please take note of the relevant online orientation sessions that will commence on 12 August and will continue until 21 August.
- A parent response form will be sent home next week to ascertain likely numbers for students whose parents would like them to return to school, when schools are officially allowed to open. This will be important, especially for secondary classes, where initial restrictions may prevent all students from returning to campus, requiring some students to continue with online learning.
- If there are any wellbeing issues that require a confidential discussion, please contact the relevant staff member. These are difficult times. We would like to assist, if possible.
- If any parents wish to withdraw their son and/or daughter from TIS due to these arrangements, we request you notify us by 21 August.



- A reminder that all outstanding fees from last semester must be cleared for students to continue this academic year. Please refer to the message on MB that was sent to all continuing families during the week.
- 2020BECE: Some Newbies would like to sit the 2020 BECE exams to bring closure. Leave for the week of exams will be approved for students requesting this action. In some ways, being online at the start of the new academic year may ease this issue for those students involved. It will be important that these students complete orientation and commence classes until the September exam period. Assuming students are focused and ready to commence 2020/2021, these students should be able to maximise their learning and revision sessions to satisfy both requirements. For university applications, MYP grades at the end of Grade 10 and DP results at the end of Grade 12 are the relevant requirements.

2020 Orientation Program

On 12 August, Newbies (students and parents) will have an online session to introduce them to our Learning Management System called ManageBac (MB). We are commencing with this session before the Welcome sessions on Monday, 17 August, as ManageBac is where all links and resources will be located for students and parents. A MB invitation will be sent to new students and parents at the end of Wednesday's session to enable access. This step often proves to be the most difficult for two reasons:

- the 'Welcome to MB' invitation is often located in the Junk/Spam folder which can be overlooked by many; and
- MB is very security conscious so passwords must pass a 'strength' test (green lights) before being approved and access allowed. In many cases, everyday passwords will not pass the test, and frustration follows. An 'easy' formula to establish a secure password the first time will be provided to students and parents on Wednesday.

Thursday, 13 August, and Friday, 14 August, is set aside to troubleshoot connection and access issues that Newbies may be experiencing, so Newbies are ready for sessions the following week.

Please check the orientation schedule in this Bulletin and 'lock-in' the required/appropriate sessions.

TIS Return To School



2020/2021 Academic Year

TIS will restart in August using Model 1: Online Learning, until the mid-semester break that commences on 17 October.

An orientation program for TIS Newbies (our new students who will join the TIS family in 2020/2021) will commence on 12 August and continue with different sessions until 21 August.

Secondary classes will commence their online lessons on 24 August while our Early Years and Primary students will start their online lessons on 31 August.

It is anticipated during the semester that the Primary School Campus will use Model 3 as its next step, while the Secondary School Campus will implement Model 2.

Different families have indicated their ongoing concern about COVID-19 within the community and it is expected that some families will continue using Model 1 for the first semester and possibly the second semester as well.

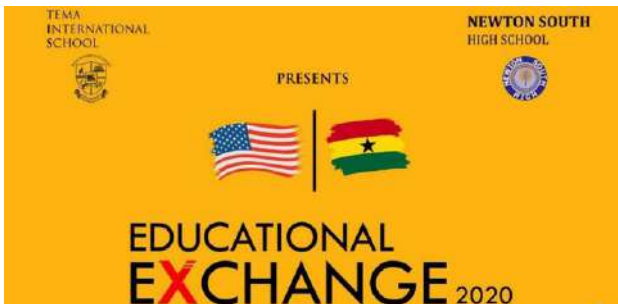

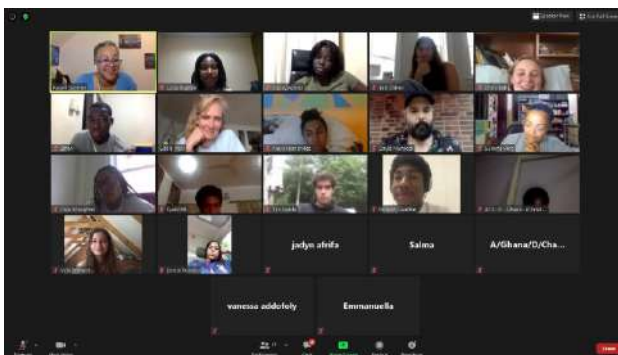

#CAS Experience – TIS & NSHS EXCHANGE

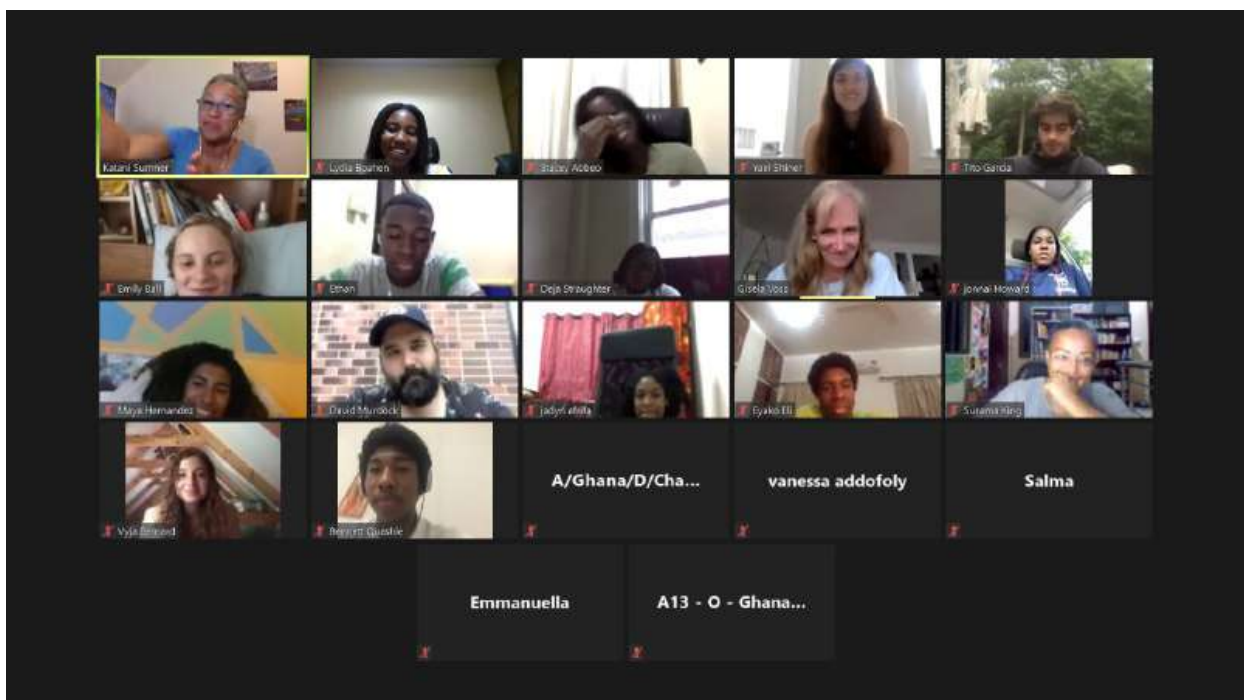


On 23 July 2020, TIS along with NSHS dropped a full stop on our 4-month-long **Online Virtual Exchange Program**. Throughout the program, we had numerous sessions discussing literally about all varieties of things - from quarantine life to racism in America, from cultural contrast to forming relationships, from time travel to politics. I really got to learn a lot of things from peers living on the other side of our globe.



We also had lots of fun activities, through which I became good friends with my partner, Deja. Together: we watched a movie (on Zoom, of course); we tried a couple of TiktTok dances, although it didn't turn out quite as we expected because neither of us were talented dancers; and we talked privately about a lot more things that we didn't get to in the sessions.

Fortunately, I even got a chance to facilitate one of the sessions with my grade mate, Lydia, which was definitely an experience for me. Looking back at myself not knowing what to expect before attending my first session in April, I really ended up gaining far more than I thought I would by coming along this wonderful journey. Therefore, I sincerely hope for us to remain connected as this program is undoubtedly valuable, beneficial and meaningful. Optimistically, our physical exchange will happen one day soon.





As I've talked holistically about the program, I want to also slightly touch on our last session, in particular. We had a very special guest, Auntie Gisela Voss, who is also a member of Unite to Light USA Organization. She gave a passionate speech on her story and how Luke's Light came about, leading her into turning pain and struggles into her inspiration to pass on Luke's remarkable legacy. I got to know how much we, as normal students, can also contribute and make extraordinary impact, and how significant our simple actions mean to those living in substandard conditions. Luke was a young man like us who dreamed Big and aimed to do bigger... his short well-lived life inspired me, as there is a lot we take for granted. Luke was an Alumnus of NSHS. Auntie Gisela also mentioned how relationships are subtle, but wonderful things to have, I really liked her expression on this: "Relationships are just like spaghetti. When you pick up one end of it, you can't find the other. But the middle part where they are all tangled up is the most delicious."

As Mama Su also said in the meeting, we never know what will happen to us in the next moment. Sometimes we can encounter horrible things and they can easily strike us down. But, instead of being trapped in negative emotions and letting ourselves sink into it, we should rather try to bravely and positively confront our challenges and finally overcome them. "Turning misery into miracle, turning lemons into lemonades."

A huge thank you to Auntie Katani, Uncle David M, Mama Su, all the NSHS participants, especially my partner, Deja, and of course my buddies and classmates. Last, but not the least, the very special guests we had, our own Alumnus, Nana-Tuyee Yaboah, a member of the TIS Pioneer Class (IB Class of 2007), Mr Eddy Tokornoo and Auntie Gisela. We did have an amazing experience. Now, we are a family, **the TIS & NSHS family**.

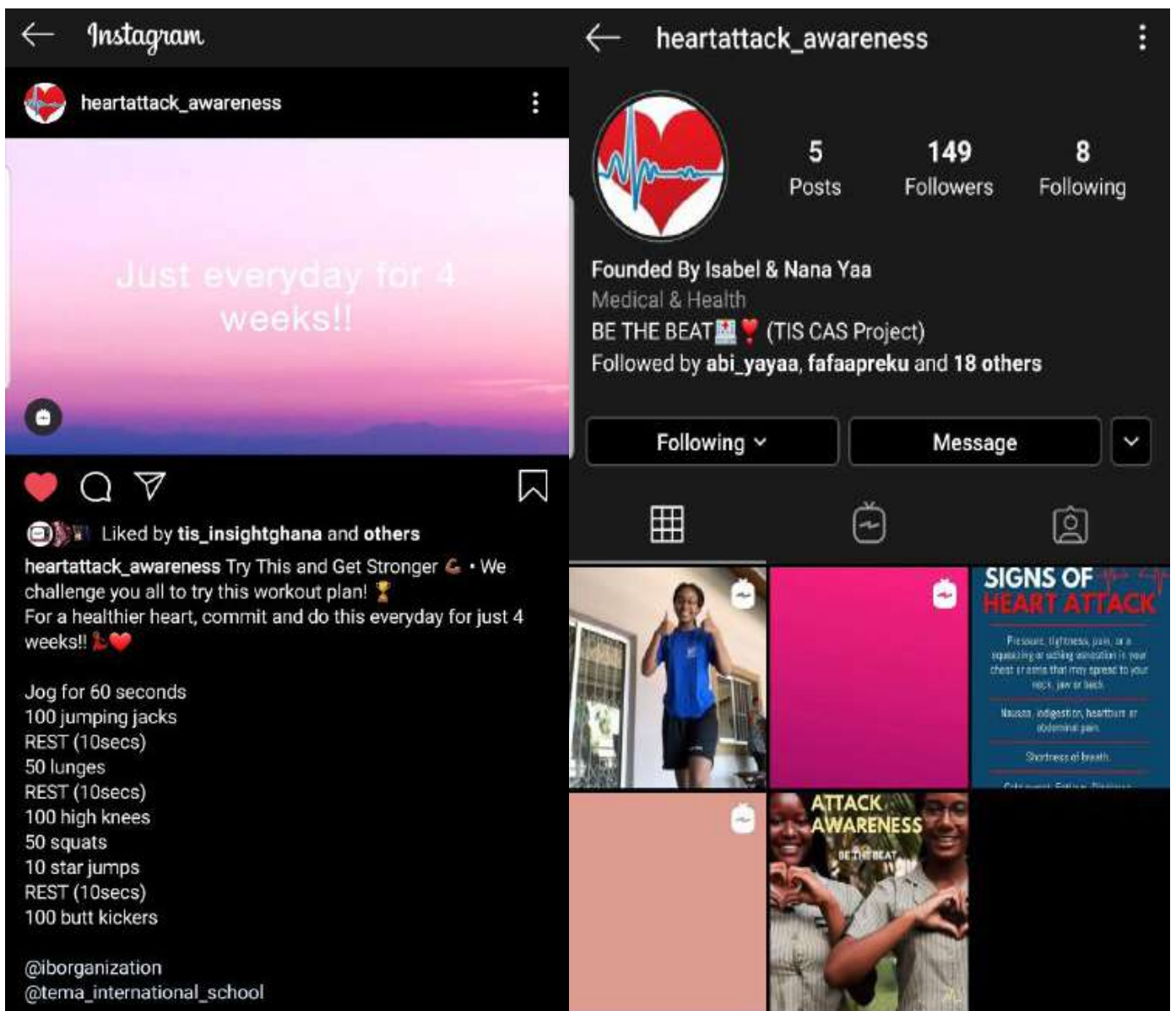
