Late advice received yesterday was the public holiday that was assigned to Farmers' Day (tomorrow) has been moved to Monday (election day).



Online Research, Plagiarism, Academic Honesty, Integrity and the IBMYP Certificate

How are all the words in the title of this article related and why are these important to the MYP?

These days, the internet is the place to carry out research for many set pieces of work in a virtual school. From some of the feedback in students' work, it is evident that much more care must be taken to read through information taken from the internet before presenting it in one's work.

In the last semester and a half, where students have not had the use of our learning centre, it has become very important to improve how we use the internet. Teachers in online classes cannot fully control plagiarism as it happens so students who now hold all the cards when it comes to controlling whether plagiarism will take place or not, owe it to themselves to uphold academic honesty and their integrity when internet research has taken place.

Students should always cite their sources, paraphrase and not insert large chunks of unbroken phrases from the internet into their work. This is very important for Grade 10 who have begun their final e-portfolios and personal projects.

So, answering to how all the words in the title of this article are related – the moment that one uses the internet for research for e-portfolios for example, plagiarism becomes a strong possibility. When plagiarism becomes a strong possibility, academic honesty has to be proven. For academic honesty to be proven, students' integrity must be steadfast because if academic integrity does not hold, neither will the IBMYP certificate at the end of MYP5.

All students should read up on academic integrity. Here are some definitions that I found online at https://libguides.reading.ac.uk/academicintegrity/about

- *Honesty* being truthful about which ideas are your own and which are derived from others, and about the methods and results of your research.
- Fairness not trying to gain an advantage by unfair means: for instance, by passing off others' work as your own.
- Responsibility taking an active role in your own learning: for instance, by seeking out the information you need to study effectively.
- *Respect* for your fellow students, your tutors, and the work of other scholars.



As a TIS student, I will:

Achievement

- Be online and on time for my virtual learning sessions.
- Submit all learning tasks.
- Check email and ManageBac everyday.
- Communicate with my teacher/s regularly via email.
- Advise my subject teacher if I am finding the work challenging or I am requiring further support.
- Have my laptop or computer fully charged and ready, my microphone working and webcam enabled.
- Engage fully in online work without any background distractions. Log out of all social media so I am not distracted during the lesson.
- Have pens and paper ready if required.
- Utilise break times with a healthy and mindful focus.
- Observe all assessment notifications.

Respect

- Only turn my microphone on when I am asked to speak or when responding to questions.
- Make sure that I am dressed appropriately for learning (something I would wear for an out of uniform day)
- Keep my online chat focused on the learning. Ensure chat is respectful of all participants.
- Keep my mobile phone off and away from me whilst I am learning online.

Commitment

- Complete all online and offline learning tasks.
- If I have technical issues, refer to MB to access each aspect of missed lessons.
- Single-task focus during online lessons. Don't be chatting, gaming or checking social media while trying to do your schoolwork.

Community

- Contribute to online discussions.
- Offer support and assistance to my peers.
- Identify myself online with my first and last name. No alias or pseudonyms are allowed.
- Join in and contribute to forum style activities as participation in these activities/reflections will inform attendance.
- Be patient but also alert the teacher to ways things may be improved.
- There is to be no filming, recording or sharing content (I must not take screenshots or record staff members presenting information to me.)
- I will inform all members of my household that I will be joining a video conference and that they can be seen (if your camera is on) and heard (if your mic is on).

Online learning is different. It is not easy. But it should suit many of our 21c learners. However, evidence is required to validate your learning. Please contact your class teacher, programme coordinator, or myself, if you are experiencing any difficulties.
