



# **School of the Future**

The purpose of schooling has evolved and some of these purposes are seen here as the development of someone who can innovate and create value in today's world; someone who knows how to ask the right questions, sees opportunity where others see challenge, and thrives on the uncertain edge that spurs creativity and invention. This would be the opposite of someone who is groomed to follow instructions and be a predictable gear in a highly structured labour force - in other words, the industrial-era skills that our "modern" educational system was designed for more than a century ago. Education should not be serving the purpose as set out those days ,but for the current needs. It is from this critical perspective that we, at TIS Primary School, set the premise for our educational philosophy and pedagogy.

Indeed; "The world no longer cares how much graduates know. What the world cares about is what these graduates can do with what they know. We risk operating in a paradigm that trains children to enter a world that no longer exists – that's the urgency." (Black, 2017). These words set off the alarm bells for a shift; one which demands a pedagogical system that meets the learners at the current times. At TIS Primary School, we have already made this shift.

True to these words, if education does not look at the current needs, but serve those set some years back ,then these words hold a lot of meaning. Thus ,the need to find that new purpose. Thus, the need to have the big overhaul: the shift. That shift that looks at developing competencies, skills and abilities that will very much be needed in the "future".

In a bid to meet this demand, TIS Primary School has placed in structures that not only develop competencies but also align with the 21<sup>st</sup> century skills. Here is how we are developing these skills along with some students' reflections:



# Checklist for DISTURBING CONTENT

Work out whether the content is right for your child. It might be around their age or just their personality, but trust your gut and put boundaries in place.

Stay up to date with pop culture. You may not care about the Bieber's or Beyonce's of this world but following sites like Pedestrian.tv and news.com.au will help you stay ahead of the game.

Tell them that they don't have to watch something if they don't want to. Brainstorm ways they can say no to their peers and feel confident making their own decisions.

Offer to watch it with them. That way you can talk through anything tough as it comes up. This can be useful even if they've already seen the content.

Read up on the issues it explores. If you show that you are comfortable and knowledgeable with the issues it explores your kids are more likely to open up to you during a tough time.

Make sure they know that not everything they see is how it appears. Have a frank conversation about not taking everything on the internet at face value.

Encourage them to practice self-care. If they are going to watch something make sure they've got an arsenal of things to pick them back up afterwards.

Let them know where to go for help. Ask them who they would feel comfortable talking to and connect them with services like ReachOut or Kids Helpline.


