#### **Admissions**


Admissions for the current year will close for Grades 9 & 11 on 10 October. Admissions for all other grades Nursery-Grade 8 will remain open.

# Exeat

There are two types of exeats: general and medical.

All students will be allowed two exeats each mid-semester. Please plan accordingly to avoid disapointments.

All exeat requests must be completed online and submitted with at least 48 hours' notice, with the exception of urgent medical issues. Weekend exeat requests must be received by the preceeding Wednesday. Any requests after this deadline will not be approved.

The integrity of an exeat request is critical.

No exeats will be granted if a student has outstanding work.

No exeats will be granted during the last week before a semester break.

Parents/Drivers must show the approval exeat from their phone to enter (NO SHOW. NO GO!).

Students must return by 5.00pm on Sundays (weekend exeats).



# **General Exeat**

A general exeat will cover passport and visa matters, as well as family events. These must not exceed more than two per mid-semester.




# **Medical Exeat**


A medical exeat will cover medical, dental, optical, and hospital appointments. When possible, appointments should be made for Saturdays, to minimise learning loss.

#### **INQUIRY THROUGH VISUAL ARTS**

At Tema International School, an IB PYP school, students inquire in a really cool way. We believe visual arts are super important for making students smart in many ways. In this article, we'll see how art is a big part of learning at the Tema International Primary School Primary campus.

#### Art makes learners more creative with the use of their imagination and creativity. It's

not just about colouring or drawing. It's about coming up with new ideas and solutions. At the Primary School campus, we want our learners to be very creative in everything they do, not just in art class. This helps them think in new and smart ways which sharpens their observation and problem-solving skills, and makes them internationally-minded.

Art in the PYP helps students learn about different cultures. Art at our campus inspires and educates the students to know about different cultures around the world. Art is like a language that everyone can understand. Through art, the learners can learn about other cultures and be more open-minded and appreciative of culture and race. Art boosts the self-confidence of the learners. Learners feel proud of themselves when they make art and others like it. This helps them believe in themselves and feel good. When they feel good about themselves, they can do better in school and in life. The transdisciplinary aspect of learning in our school helps learners connect their art to all other subject disciplines, thereby creating a broader and deeper understanding of all concepts under inquiry.

#### **Learning Support**

At TIS, teaching and non-teaching staff share a collective responsibility for supporting the inclusive learning of the students in our community. Guided by our policies, we encourage teamwork between staff, students, parents and the learning support office to support learning diversity for all our students.

Learning support at TIS is in addition to subject specific support which subject teachers give.

Students may be referred to the learning support supervisor, Mr Solomon Addotey, or they may visit him themselves. Parents are also encouraged to inform the admissions team of existing learning support needs of their ward during the admissions process. however, parents should initially contact the programme coordinators if learning support concerns develop during the semester. The programme coordinators may need to request access (special) arrangements for students during their IB examinations if they receive documented information early enough.

The supervisor may prepare resources to help improve learning for students with specific learning needs so that they continue to receive access to the programmes. All school community members responsible for students' learning support will monitor learning and meet at regular intervals to evaluate progress. Students will take an active part and remain at the centre of their own learning.

#### **MYP 5-Year Review**

Inclusion and celebrating learning diversity is an integral part of our mission at Tema International School (TIS). In our drive to improve inclusion and diversity last academic year, the Middle Years' Programme (MYP) development focused on striving for 100% access to the curriculum and to our examination process, especially for our MYP5 students. Actions such as these form part of the current 5-year review process undertaken by the IB to ensure that, as an International Baccalaureate World School (IBWS), TIS can work towards promoting equality in access to an IB education for all students.

TIS has been running the MYP for the last seven years. It has been an authorised MYP school for the last five years. This October, as has been publicised in our school calendar, the International Baccalaureate (IB) will conduct its 5-year verification of TIS as an MYP school. As part of the verification process, the IB will be visiting the school to find out how we have been delivering the MYP. This visit will include meeting school community members and interacting with students and parents alike. This is to verify that the school community keeps abreast of the MYP at TIS. This process will also evaluate how we have grown since our authorisation as an MYP school. As the IB team cannot speak to everyone, they are happy to engage with a few members of our community to speak as representatives for us all.

Much of the information the IB requires from us is sent to them electronically. The rest, they acquire via virtual meetings with the school community members. The revised verification process focusses on four key standards. Purpose, Environment, Culture and Learning. The impact on students is at the centre of these standards. This process promotes programme development and growth in areas in which a school has strengths, or in which a school works to develop its strengths. At TIS, we have celebrated 100% access to the MYP curriculum, irrespective of learning diversity, for several years. We continue to demonstrate growth in our interdisciplinary learning and personal projects where this year, we celebrated 100% in grades 4 to 7 in the May 2023 MYP examinations. We continue to trail-blaze in authentic IBMYP provision in Ghana. This is and continues to be a testament to the Environment, Culture and Learning practices that we continue to develop and provide in the MYP.

Once again, as publicised, the MYP verification visit takes place from 16-18 October inclusive.


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



I Veronica Arthur here with Balma Naasr-Deen and we are the cofounders of CODE **RED.** Code Red started off as a Service as initiative Action to girls supply in our community with sanitary towels. We did research some and that found out the majority of them can't afford sanitary towels, end using so up unhygienic, and unconventional methods to deal with their blood flow. In that situation we were able to raise a large sum of money in which we bought and made donations to Tetteh Ocloo School of the Deaf. They were so grateful, and it was really humbling and amazing to see the appreciation they had,

and the genuine joy on their faces.

However, since our last significant outreach we've been doing some thinking and realised that although it was a good initiative, it was not sustainable. That's when we decided to go reusable! We thought it was a great idea to make reusable sanitary towels rather than donate them, as we are putting an end to the problem. The reusable sanitary towels can be used over and over and can even be used as a method for girls to practice hygiene, as there will be constant washing of the towels.

Last Christmas, during our Christmas Drive we donated 55 reusable kits. That was mind blowing and the young girls who received are using these kits till now. This new phase puts an end to the disposal of plastics which damages our environment, cuts out all costs, and begins the journey in the sustainable direction, and we are more than glad to be doing this with a supportive team. We intend to raise 20,000 Ghana cedis to be able to purchase all materials necessary for the production of the reusable sanitary towels. We are hoping to make over 200 kits. Without all that being said, we ask that you donate a generous amount to the number on the flyer below, so we can make this aspiration possible.

#### Reflections


