Since 2018, much has been achieved at TIS over these five years due to our Co-Founders' vision and values. MYP authorisation, the new Primary School, PYP authorisation, DP scores of 43, 44 and 45, 100% pass rates, curriculum initiatives, and that global experience that stopped the world, COVID. Additionally, TIS became an Award Centre for the Duke of Edinburgh International Awards, affectionately called the Dukies. These niche awards complement our four pillars, with a substantial emphasis on personal challenges. Since 2018, we have conducted 11 expedition trips, been awarded the best award centre in Ghana and 154 students have been awarded Gold (75), Silver (22) and Bronze (57) level awards over this period. One student has completed each award, a stunning achievement.



In April 2014, she gained admission into the prestigious Graduate Entry Medical Programme at the University of Ghana School of Medicine and Dentistry. Here, Dr Efua Thompson excelled in her studies and graduated in 2018. She is currently a staff member at UGMC and is pursuing specialised training in obstetrics and gynaecology at Korle Bu.

Aside from her medical career, Dr Efua Thompson has an entrepreneurial spirit. As the CEO of Baked by Antwiwaa, she specialises in creating delectable specialty cakes and cupcakes. Her skills and passion in medical and culinary worlds demonstrate her versatility and dedication to excellence.

### **Professor Fred McBagonluri**

Professor Fred McBagonluri is an inventor, innovator, novelist and thought leader. He was born at East Legon, Accra, Ghana in 1970. He is the President and Provost of Academic City College, Haatso, Accra. He was the founding Dean of Engineering at Ashesi University. Before his Ashesi appointment, he was Vice President of New Product Development at Joerns Healthcare, Arlington, TX.

He also held roles of increasing responsibilities for Fortune 500 companies in the US. He was Director of Research and Development, and Director of IT at Siemens Medical. He was also the World-Wide Director of Research and Development, and, subsequently Director of Market Development at Becton Dickinson and Co., the world's largest manufacturer of injection systems.



He started his education at the University Staff Village Primary and Middle, Legon and St. Louis Preparatory School at Wa. He graduated from Nandom Secondary School in 1990 with a distinction and attended St. Augustine's College in Cape Coast for sixth form. He earned a Head of State Award to the United States in 1991.

Professor McBagonluri holds an MBA from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology as a Sloan Fellow and earned a PhD in Materials Engineering from the School of Chemical and Materials Engineering, University of Dayton, Dayton, OH., a Masters degree in Engineering Science and Mechanics from Virginia Tech, Blacksburg, VA., and a Bachelor's of Science in Manufacturing Engineering (Summa cum laude) from Central State University, Wilberforce, OH. Additionally, he was a Visiting Scholar and Research Associate at the School of Aeronautics and Astronautics, Purdue University and the School of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering at Princeton University, respectively.

Professor McBagonluri is a recipient of the 2008 US Black Engineer of the Year: Most Promising Scientist Award, 2008 NJBiz Innovator Hero Award, and was 2009 Finalist of the NASA Astronaut Candidate Corps (ASCAN). He is a co-inventor on 22 issued US patents and has numerous technical publications.



# THE DREAM

Mrs Comfort Adjavon began her dream of establishing a public coeducational institution over forty (40) years ago when she was a Principal Superintendent in the Ghana Education Service (GES). This dream was, however, shelved when she ventured into poultry and livestock farming after she had voluntarily retired from the GES, at the age of forty-five (45) years.

Thirteen (13) years into farming and her first love, teaching and the school environment, came back to compete with her new-found vocation of farming. Farming lost!

The rebirth of the love for the school environment was given a more decisive impetus when, as faith would have it, Sonia, her late granddaughter's medical challenges did not allow her to be appropriately integrated into the regular school system, despite her determination to do so.

The above situation affected Mrs. Adjavon's initial dream of establishing a school within the national system. However, acting upon the encouragement and support of her husband and daughter Catherine (all deceased) and friends, she penned down the plan for the establishment of a special needs school for challenged children.

However, there emerged a dramatic turnaround in the plan to establish a special needs school following the enrolment of one of their daughters to British School of Lome (BSL), an international school in Togo. They were inspired by the progress they saw with her, from the exposure to the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programmes (IB DP). The couples' relationship with BSL had a great impact on the initial dream and re-directed their focus to the establishment of a standard international school of repute.

After further consultations and counsel from Experts in Academia such as Professor James Tooley of Newcastle University and Dr. Mrs. Margaret Nkrumah (the then Principal of S.O.S Hermann Gmeiner International College-SOSHGIC), the couple were convinced that the IGCSE and IB Diploma Programme would be in sync with their vision of producing world class citizens who could hold their own wherever they found themselves. This culminated in a company incorporated and called Tema International School Ltd for the establishment and construction of Tema International School (TIS) with the late Mr. Adjavon providing the financial wherewithal for the funding of the school's infrastructure consistent with the semblance of an international school and backed by the supervisory support of Mrs. Adjavon.

On 3rd October 2003, Tema International School was officially opened and dream which gave birth to this journey and revised along the way was finally realised!

### ACQUISITION OF LAND AND CONSTRUCTION OF STRUCTURES

Characteristic of every dream, Mr and Mrs Adjavon had their fair share of challenges. One huge issue was the hurdle of land acquisition, which took the Founders four (4) years to surmount.

After that, there was the need for an architect and a foreman to get the project off the

ground. Mr. Samuel Jassie-Sarkodie and Mr Kobla Kotoka Ahiadorme were brought in as

the architect and foreman, respectively. This "Dream Team" facilitated the building of infrastructure and ably supervised by Mrs Adjavon among others to receive the first cohort of students, "the Pioneers"

These structures were the hostels, a 12-classroom block and the multi-Purpose Hall. At that

time, the infirmary was located in one of the rooms in the Catherine Hostel, while the Art

Studio was located in the gallery of the multi-Purpose Hall. The Library, Administration

offices, Music Laboratory, Science Laboratory and Computer

Laboratories were all located in empty classrooms.

Twenty years on, there have been massive improvements in the school's infrastructure at the original site (the Main Campus). Departments housed in classrooms have found permanent locations, with some even expanding. The school has the following facilities:

- An Administration Block.
- The Einstein Resource Centre houses the computer laboratories and all the science laboratories and an examination hall.
- The Handel-Picasso Block, which houses the art studios, the theatre and drama studio, music laboratories, language laboratory and an examination hall.
- An imposing multi-chambered library named the "Adjavon Library" now called the Learning Centre.
- Standard-sized football pitch.
- Fully equipped Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS), Service in action, After School

Activities (ASA), Community Projects and Design Block, including the media and dance room, known as the Project Centre.

- An ultra-modern sports complex with a well-equipped gym, a semi-Olympic-sized swimming pool, two squash courts, indoor volleyball, handball, badminton, basketball and tennis courts.
- Other outstanding features of TIS are the 30plus staff apartments and semi-detached houses, some fully furnished and accommodating key staff members.

In their honour, some edifices were named after parents, children and a grandchild of Mr and Mrs Adjavon as follows:

- Francis Hostel named in honour of his daughter, Frances, and his father, Franz.
- Anthony Hostel named after their son, Anthony.
- Catherine Hostel: named in honour of their daughter, Catherine.
- Cecilia Hostel: named after his Mother and daughter., both named Cecilia.
- Sonia Infirmary in memory of their late granddaughter, Sonia.

























#### **FOOTPRINTS OF GREAT MINDS**

67 pioneer students commenced on the first day of its opening. 45 students were admitted into Grade 9, and 22 were accepted into Grade 7.

With the support of the then Minister of Education, Hon Mr Yaw Osafo Marfo, TIS was officially inaugurated on the 18 June, 2005 by his Deputy Minister Mr. Twumasi Ampofo.

#### **AUTHORISATION TO OFFER IB DP & IGCSE CURRICULA**

After meetina the International Baccalaureate Organisation's (IB) and Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) stringent criteria, TIS obtained authorisation to establish the IGCSE and IB DP programmes in 2003 and 2005 respectively, with Mr. Trevor Trumper appointed as the first IB DP Coordinator. He was succeeded by Mr. Boakye Yiadom (2006-2012) and then by Mrs Deepa Boodhoo (2012-2015).

The IGCSE Programme was first coordinated by Mr Richard Laryea and it was coordinated by Mr Samuel Atindana, from 2005 until 2019.

#### **SAT & ACT CENTRE**

TIS applied and received approval in 2010 and 2014 to conduct SAT & ACT Tests, respectively, making it the first official SAT and ACT Centres in Tema.

#### **TEST OF RESOLVE**

On 15 December, 2014, a colossus of a Co-Founder, Mr Alphonse Ayite Adjavon, was called to eternal glory, having given back hugely to posterity and mankind. May his generous and gentle soul rest in peace.

Though this was a big loss to the TIS community and tested our collective resolve, as he would have had us done, we recomposed ourselves quickly and got back to work: continuing the mission and vision of TIS.

## INTRODUCTION OF THE MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME (MYP)

In 2016, TIS became a candidate school when it introduced the MYP curriculum to bridge the apparent gap identified between IGCSE and IBDP.

This introduction also saw the:

- Redesigning of the classrooms into subject classrooms.
- Creation of a very comfortable staff lounge.
- Redesigning of Departmental offices to allow collaboration amongst members of the same department, aimed at giving students superior support.
- The creation of a digital examination hall to hold eAssessments.

TIS was authorised to offer the IB Middle Years Programme on 3 December 2018. Since then, TIS has strived to implement MYP authentically across Grades 7-10, with final year students completing a Personal Project and the MYP eAssessments. Students in Grade 8 complete a Community project requirement.

In Grades 7-8, students experience all MYP subjects to make informed decisions with the subject selections in Grade 9. All grades complete an interdisciplinary unit each year. Annual results reveal strengths in Personal Project and interdisciplinary studies. MYP implemented AssessPrep software so that all

students across MYP classes and can familiarise themselves with online exams (eAssessments) in readiness for their final external exams at the end of Grade 10.

Implementing MYP at TIS has ensured a smooth transition from middle to senior years of schooling. There is evidence of a strong correlation of final grades in MYP and DP.

Mr Ate Hemmes was appointed as the inaugural MYP Coordinator in 2016. Ms Yvonne Tagoe has been the MYP Coordinator since 2018.

# INTRODUCTION OF THE PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAMME (PYP)

Towards the end of 2017, TIS started construction work on a Primary School project which is expected to offer the Primary Years Programme (PYP) of the 1B continuum.

Tema International Primary School Campus embarked on its educational journey with just twelve students on 3 October, 2019. What began as a humble start soon became a thriving institution, leaving an indelible mark on its community. Nestled within the heart of a vibrant community, the TIS Primary Campus embarked on an indelible journey that has witnessed remarkable growth and transformation. The journey was not without challenges, but the school's commitment to nurturing young minds and fostering a love of learning remained its driving force.

From the inception of the TIS Primary Campus, student growth has been at the heart of its mission. In its first year, composite classes brought together students of different ages, fostering collaboration and a sense of unity. By Year 3, the student population had grown. This growth prompted transitioning from composite classes to standalone grade levels, allowing for more tailored instruction. The TIS Primary Campus continues to prioritise holistic development, nurturing well-rounded students who excel academically and thrive socially and emotionally.

The TIS Primary Campus's physical growth paralleled its academic expansion. In its early years, the campus provided a cozy environment suitable for its initial student body. However, by Year 4, the school underwent significant changes. Physical expansion brought new classrooms, creating a vibrant and stimulating learning environment. Introducing specialised facilities, such as a music lab and art classrooms, showcased the school's commitment to providing students with the tools they needed to thrive. Additionally, we saw the establishment of three dedicated playgrounds, promoting physical activity and social interaction as integral components of the TIS Primary Campus experience.

At its inception in 2019, the school had already made the significant step of applying for the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (IB PYP) candidacy. It was verified for the programme within a record time later in 2020 and certified by February 2021. This remarkable achievement unfolded amidst the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. During this period, teachers courageously navigated the use of technology to facilitate the authorisation process. Additionally, the school seamlessly transitioned from the PYP legacy framework (guided by the Programme Standards and Practices 2014 (PSP2014) to the enhanced PYP framework (Guided by the PSP2020) while steadfastly upholding the core principles of IB education.

The TIS Primary Campus story is one of remarkable growth and transformation, reflecting its dedication to providing a holistic education and empowering students to excel academically,

emotionally, and socially. It serves as a testament to the power of dedication and resilience in shaping the future of education. Mr Jacob Lumumba has been the PYP Coordinator since 2019.

## THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH INTERNATIONAL AWARDS SCHEME

In 2018, TIS became an Award Centre for the Duke of Edinburgh International Awards, affectionately called the Dukies. These niche awards complement our four pillars, with a substantial emphasis on personal challenges. Since 2018, we have conducted 11 expedition trips, been awarded the best award centre in Ghana and 154 students have been awarded Gold (75), Silver (22) and Bronze (57) level awards over this period.







Talking of vision, allow me to borrow the words of Jacobs (2010), who states.

"To move our school structures into more open, fluid, and correspondingly inventive forms, we need new forms, not reform". Indeed, Tema International School (TIS) is, in its own right, a unique version/form of education.

In this breath, it makes sense to state that the vision of the TIS Founders can very well be seen and lived at the TIS Primary School. TIS Primary School runs the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (IB PYP), and this

completes the continuum of the IB Programmes run by our school. The exposure provided to our Primary School students gives them the readiness to move on and excel within our Middle Years Programme (MYP). IB PYP at the TIS Primary School, employs both social and cognitive constructivism, where learning takes centre stage from a transdisciplinary point of view. The essence of this approach is to build capacity among our students so they become future-ready.

Truth be said, the purpose of schooling has evolved and some of these purposes are seen here as the development of someone who can innovate and create value in today's world; someone who knows how to ask the right questions, sees opportunity where others see challenge, and thrives on the uncertain edge that spurs creativity and invention. This would be the opposite of someone groomed to follow instructions and be a predictable gear in a highly structured labour force - in other words, the industrial-era skills that the educational system was designed for more than a century ago. As we celebrate these 20 years of excellence in education, TIS Primary School is marking its fourth year since its inception. Our beautiful campus was officially unveiled and set to run on 3 October, 2019. Then, the space and our numbers dictated that we set up composite classes; "A totally new concept" But! very well taken in, quickly learned and adopted. Today, we are proud to have the space and numbers for fully-fledged classes. Despite the challenges brought in by the

COVID-19 pandemic, at TIS Primary School, we saw only opportunities that were rendered to the growth of our online learning systems and the building of our virtual tools. Indeed, this did not deter us from our path towards the school's authorisation to run the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (IB PYP), which we attained in what could be considered a record time. TIS Primary School was authorised to run the IB PYP in February 2021. We are now preparing for the upcoming programme evaluation.

At our inception, the IB PYP was undergoing what was known as the programme enhancement. This was actually a programme review that saw the expounding of the Programe Standards and Practices (PSP). True to the values of our Founders, the enhancements brought liquidity and flexibility that broadened the curriculum to advance more learning rather than simply teaching. "Reflection and Assessments" were surely enhanced and expanded to envelop the entire learning process flow. The instructional staff were not only undergoing a transformation through training from the traditional approaches of educational delivery but also of the programme implementation. As Tema International School celebrates this 20th anniversary, TIS Primary School is proud to boast of a fully "enhanced" faculty that lives the vision of our founders.

Congratulations are in order. The dream lives on. Marking 20 years of continuous education excellence is a great milestone and TIS Primary School is lucky to be part of this achievement.

Seven years ago, Tema International School ((TIS) took the bold step to offer the Middle Years Programme (MYP) of the International Baccalaureate (IB). decision was taken to offer the MYP from MYP2 (Grade 7) and open up a new MYP grade every year till we reached MYP5 (Grade 10). To say this was a bold step is an understatement; it was a leap of faith. After all, the history of the MYP Ghana was very thin on the ground and there were no points of reference from which we could draw inspiration in any school close in the country because of our unique vision. This most likely worked in our favour because looking within ourselves and recalling why TIS began, we have gone on to build an MYP that speaks of the very dream of our Founders while upholding the IB vision. Today, the MYP at TIS is offered to 141 students from Ghana and worldwide.

The MYP at TIS has embraced diversity fully and found ways to offer access to the curriculum for all students who enrolled for the programme, irrespective of their

learning diversity. The MYP at TIS has given confidence to so many young learners who through Service as Action and our Community projects have realised how powerful it is to own service to the surrounding communities. The MYP at TIS has given confidence to our final-year students whose dreams of creating a truly Personal Project have been supported and made a reality. Again, the dream of our Founders to give hope and empower young people can be seen in many of our past personal projects, for example, a water purification unit for rural communities, building an off-road vehicle, creating a Latino-Ghanaian cookbook, designing clothing, musical compositions to name but a few. The display of our projects held every March is a fantastic testament to what the MYP at TIS has empowered students to do.

The MYP at TIS in recent years has also played an important part in holding the IB Continuum together. This year, we welcomed students from our first cohort of past TIS PYP pupils into MYP4 (Grade 9). These young people are a group of students who are immersed in the IB dream and act as magnets in drawing other students towards the MYP. As part of the continuum, an important focus of the MYP is to ensure that students feel prepared for the Diploma Programme (DP) of the IB and for life after TIS through deliberate interventions to improve all approaches to learning skills from beginner stages to intermediate and even mastery where possible before students reach DP1. These skills are taught explicitly and are a key requirement for completing e-portfolios, including the Personal Project and e-assessments, including the interdisciplinary learning examination at the end of MYP5.

This October, during our 20th anniversary, the significance of celebrating the achievements of a school whose inception was borne out of a need for an inclusive education experience is not lost on me as MYP Coordinator. TIS also celebrates five years as an

authorised MYP provider. After carving a tailor-made path in inclusive education in MYP, I am very proud to be part of an institution that for the last 20 years, has set standards in education and is now trail-blazing in MYP education. None of this would have been possible without our Founders and Founding family, past and present parents who have had faith in us, and past and present members of staff in all their various capacities who have supported the legacy passed on to us.

To Mrs Comfort Adjavon, I say a special "thank you" for your vision.

To the entire TIS community, I say "Enjoy a very happy and blessed 20th Anniversary!"

We have come far. 20 years is no mean achievement in the life of a school, and we deserve to celebrate. Before I proceed, however, it is to acknowledge the work done by my predecessors over the years to help bring the school to where we find it today: Mr Richard Laryea, Mr Trevor Trumper, Mr Opoku Boakye Yiadom, Ms Deepa Boodhoo, Mr Chander Dev, Mr David Spooner, Mr Benjamin Darko and Mr Eric Fudzagbo, the Deputy DP Coordinator who also assisted my predecessor. We equally recognise all our former staff who played diverse roles in making us who we have become today.

With the first diploma examination taken by the pioneering class of thirty-nine (39) students in 2007, TIS has prepared 17 different cohorts totalling 921 students of which 824 have gone ahead to write the full diploma examinations. We have seen the sense in allowing the remaining 97 students to write the IB Diploma Courses, which ensured they studied what they needed for the

programmes they wished to study at their universities. Some read four, five and even six subjects and opted out of the Theory of Knowledge and/or the Extended Essay, which reduced their workloads and gave them more time to focus on their studies. It is refreshing to know that all those who take the Diploma courses also get accepted into their desired university programmes.

As a school, we have made significant progress in our academic performance over the years. From the lowest passing percentage of 59.4% in 2008, staff and students of TIS have made consistent efforts to improve this and the last five examination sessions have seen passing rates of 92.3%, 93.3%, 98.2%, 100% and 100%, respectively.

Mr. Chander Dev in the 15th Anniversary celebration brochure, concluded with, "We dedicate ourselves on this 15th Anniversary to work with all our focus in realising our Founders' dream of making TIS the best school in West Africa in the next 5 years." We do not have enough data to compare our results with other West African schools, but we know that in the May 2023 IB Diploma examination session, Tema International School obtained the highest IB Diploma Points in Ghana and also ensured that we once again secured a 100% Diploma passes - the only school in Ghana to have achieved this - and our students continue to get into some of the top universities in Ghana and abroad with good funding. The Founders' vision of building an international school of choice, nurturing world-class citizens, and responsive to the needs of society, has come to fruition looking at the various Creativity, Activity and Service programmes undertaken by our students. We produce world-class citizens who have shown care and will go to every length to ensure a peaceful world for all to live in.



#### SERVICE AS A CORE VALUE: TIS STUDENTS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

At TIS, service is ingrained in our core values, shaping the experiences of our students from PYP, MYP, and DP levels. Over the years, our students have embarked on numerous service projects that have impacted themselves and the wider community. From donating learning supplies and organising food and book drives to renovating libraries, building schools, paying hospital fees, and constructing vital infrastructure, such as boreholes, refurbishing a toilet facility for a local school, refurbishing a home for orphans, and constructing a placenta pit, our students have touched the lives of many beneficiaries. We are proud to highlight some of our notable service projects that showcase the dedication and commitment of our students:

- 1. The Akorlikope Project: Started by the IB Class of 2012, the Akorlikope Project was a sustained CAS service project for nine years. Each DP class, from 2012 to 2020, has contributed to the development of the community, especially the children, by providing basic educational needs and raising funds to complete a school building, library, headmaster's office, playground, bathroom, and canteen. In 2021, this project successfully concluded, with the infrastructure handed over to Mr. Stephen Dodze, the caretaker/headmaster of the school and the Ghana Education Service. TIS will forever be a part of the Akorlikope community's history. Congratulations to all our DP students from the IB Class of 2012 to the IB Class of 2020.
- **2. Operation Smile (NGO):** Operation Smile Ghana is the country's largest provider of cleft care. The IB Class of 2024 raised over \$ 3,000 to cover the total cost of corrective surgeries for three patients: Seraphine Aklasu, Albert Arthur, and Blessing Ebu Asabea.
- **3. Flamestar by Samra:** In 2021, two Grade 8 girls initiated a community project called Flamestar. They raised GHC 6,000 to construct a Placenta Pit at the Jericho Health Centre in Ashaiman.

This project aims to support the clinic in the effective disposal of biological waste.

- **4. SaniFlush CAS Project:** A group of students from the DP class of 2023 undertook a CAS project called SaniFlush. They raised approximately GHC 30,000 to construct a 6-unit washroom facility, purchase toiletries, and provide a Polytank to Ashaiman No.2 JSS, a local school within the Ashaiman Municipal region.
- **5. EcoAid Project:** The EcoAid Project, led by a group of students from the DP class of 2023, raised GHC 60,000 to refurbish the Boys Dormitory at the Echoing Hills Village. This centre accommodates 21 children with physical and mental spectrum abilities.
- **6. Operation Replay:** In 2022/2023, six students, 3 DP and 3 MYP students initiated the Operation Replay community project. They raised GHC 19,000 to refurbish and install a playground at the Tetteh Ocloo School for the Deaf, highlighting the importance of play in the lives of all children.
- **7. Spectrum Connect:** Two DP students engaged in a CAS project called Spectrum Connect, collaborating with the HopeSetters Autism Centre. They organised a Fun Day of activities and experiences for children from the centre and raised approximately GHC 20,000 to support the HopeSetters Autism Centre.
- **8. Biblotheque Saint Juene:** A community project led by three MYP students raised GHC 15,000 to refurbish the library at St. John's Academy in Ashiaman Bethlehem. The team contributed by donating furniture and textbooks to enhance the learning experience.



- **9. Do Great Things:** A group of students from the DP class of 2021 initiated the Do Great Things CAS project. They raised GHC 40,000 in collaboration with the KJM Foundation to construct a borehole in Fotobi, Eastern Region, providing portable drinking water to the community.
- 10. Unite To Light Ghana Initiative: Initiated by a group of Alumni, led by Nubuke Gadzekpo Amoah, in collaboration with alumni from various year groups. Students from the IB Classes of 2021 till now have dedicated to growing the project. The project focused on sustainability and clean light, aiming to raise awareness about the importance of solar energy and the detrimental effects of fossil fuel light. Over the past five years, 4000 LED Solar Luke Lights and 200 Solar Power Banks have been distributed in Ghana, benefitting areas without electricity. The success of this project was made possible through collaboration with various organisations, churches, and individuals. I am also the author of "The Matriarch's Verse" and "When The Person Who is Called COVID Came" - two poetry collections.

I founded "TeamApiorkor", a constellation of highly skilled and passionate individuals.

The group runs on the tenets of creative entrepreneurship and art business, focusing on creative development, marketing and communications, creative product development, creative event production and general consultancy for artistic endeavours. All of this leads to advocating for African artists and promoting literacy.

In collaboration with musical prodigy and genius, NiiQuaye [Nii Quaye Aryee], my team and I are using my creative entrepreneurial journey as a fluid case study to explore and establish a blueprint that works for the 21st-century Ghanaian and African artist.

In media, I am currently the Head of Programmes Production at Accra-based Citi 97.3 FM/ Citi TV, where I also host "Diplomatic License" and "What's Cooking?" while advocating for the causes of literacy and numeracy education, appreciation of the creative

arts and art business, and culture.

As a general media practitioner, I am a multi-format/ multi-scale television producer and programmer with 11,000+ hours of content, to my credit. I am also a multi-format radio producer and programmer.

I teach, mentor and counsel poets, writers, creatives, budding media practitioners and young people (especially young women).

How TIS Shaped My Foundations and Influenced My Life: My time in TIS equipped me with the ability to think critically, analyse situations, not judge a book by its cover, have an inquiring mind and be in tune with my society and my surroundings. I learned how to be mindful of culture and its effect on the psychology of a society and to always remember that by virtue of my privileges, I have a responsibility to give back to and shape my society. I encourage current students to be appreciative of the opportunity that they have to be a member of this great school. It is difficult to see how something might influence your future positively when you have no idea what the future looks like. Nonetheless, trust the process, trust your teachers and take responsibility for your own learning. Use the opportunity to learn any and everything that you can. Read widely. Ask questions. Question answers and theories. Make good friends. Learn from your friends. Sit in classes that you are not even taking and learn something new. Dance. Sing. Act. Play an instrument. Advocate for the better. Be a student leader. Befriend the security officers, janitors, kitchen staff and drivers. Converse with the principal and administrative staff. Travel. Eat something new. Be the living and breathing definition of what TIS represents.
