Admissions 2024/2025

Admissions for the next academic year are now open for the secondary school, Grades 7-12.

The first round of admissions will be completed by 30 November. The second round will commence in February.

Prospective students are required to complete application forms online via <u>https://tis.openapply.com</u>

Only candidates who have fully completed the application form will be contacted for the aptitude test and subsequent interview.

Prospective families are encouraged to *arrange a school tour before or during the application process*.

Early applications and admissions are encouraged. Late applications will be considered, if vacancies exist.

Grades 7, 8 and 9 applicants will be required to provide three current term or two semester reports.

Applicants for Grade 11 will be required to provide three current term or two semester reports, predicted grades and a recommendation letter. When final results are released, applicants must attach a scanned copy on OpenApply. The release of final results will confirm subject selection levels (Standard or Higher).

After the completion of the Middle Years Programme (Grade 10), TIS students are expected to complete the IB Diploma Programme in Grades 11 and 12. They will make initial subject selection choices during the second semester of Grade 10. The release of examination results will confirm subject selection levels (Standard or Higher). Please note that students are generally not accepted into Grades 10 and 12,

Exeat

There are two types of exeats: general and medical.

All students will be allowed two exeats each mid-semester. Please plan accordingly to avoid disapointments.

All exeat requests must be completed online and submitted with at least 48 hours' notice, with the exception of urgent medical issues. Weekend exeat requests must be received by the preceeding Wednesday. Any requests after this deadline will not be approved.

The integrity of an exeat request is critical.

No exeats will be granted if a student has outstanding work.

No exeats will be granted during the last week before a semester break.

Parents/Drivers must show the approval exeat from their phone to enter (NO SHOW. NO GO!).

Students must return by 5.00pm on Sundays (weekend exeats).



General Exeat

A general exeat will cover passport and visa matters, as well as family events. These must not exceed more than two per mid-semester.

Medical Exeat

A medical exeat will cover medical, dental, optical, and hospital appointments. When possible, appointments should be made for Saturdays, to minimise learning loss.

The Power of Play in Learning @ TIS Primary School

Play-based learning is a teaching and learning approach centred on children's natural inclination to play. It is an essential part of the Primary Years Programme (PYP) in the International Baccalaureate (IB) curriculum. As a school, understanding the benefits of play-based learning and how to implement it is crucial.

Play is a vital component of education, as it is a powerful tool for learning and development in young children. Through play, children explore their world, develop essential social and cognitive skills, and build a solid foundation for future learning. Play fosters creativity, problem-solving, and imagination, enabling children to experiment, make sense of their surroundings, and interact with peers. In this dynamic and interactive environment, they learn cooperation, communication, and spatial awareness concepts. As educators, we recognise that play is not just leisure but a fundamental educational activity that lays the groundwork for a lifelong love of learning and intellectual growth.

Play has the potential to nurture learners and enable them to develop the ATL Skills (Communication, Research, Thinking, Self-management, and Social) as well as the attributes of the IB learner profile (inquirer, communicator, caring, risk-taker, principled, open-minded, reflective, thinker, balanced, and knowledgeable).

In TIS Primary School, play-based learning is a teaching approach that uses play to support children's learning and development. It is based on the idea that children learn best when they are actively engaged in the learning process. Play-based learning is an effective way to help children develop social, emotional, cognitive, and physical skills. It encourages creativity, problem-solving, and critical thinking, and promotes a positive attitude towards learning.

TIS Primary School provides different types of play experiences. These include:

- Unstructured play
- Structured play

The learning environment itself is a huge part of fostering a playful environment. At TIS, for example, our IB educators ensure the learning environment offers a variety of spaces where children can feel free and take comfort. There are open spaces, an early years playground, and a playroom. The lower and upper primary also have two separate playgrounds that are used for outdoor learning and play. All learning spaces are open-ended and encourage play-based learning.

Ewura Adwoa: I love to play with the connecting pipes because I learn more and feel good to play with them.

Our learners also learn to empathise with others by taking on the role of a character, which helps them learn empathy and understanding of different perspectives through role play.





#MYP – Avenues for Principled Actions

As shared in previous bulletins, Service as Action is a unique opportunity for students to take actions concerning issues within their immediate environments. It encourages students to connect what they learn in the classroom to real-world experiences and make a positive impact in their local community. It also allows students to Explore, Plan, Implement and Reflect on their efforts to impact their local environment positively.

Exploration: Students begin by exploring various local issues or needs in their



community. This can involve research, discussions, and understanding the context of the issues they want to address. They may also identify their personal interests and skills that they can bring to their service projects.

Plan: Students design a service project after identifying a particular issue or need. This involves planning and brainstorming how they can contribute to addressing the issue. They set goals, outline tasks, and establish timelines for their projects.


Implementation: During the designated hour in class, students work on implementing their service projects. This may involve volunteering, organising events, creating awareness campaigns, or other hands-on efforts to make a positive impact. They put their plans into action. This is where they make the connection explicit by using classroom content to address the explored or identified need.

Reflection: Reflection is a crucial part of the Service as Action component. Students regularly reflect on their experiences, what they've learned, and the impact of their efforts. It's common for students to document their *actions & service* experiences on their portfolios or worksheets on MB for both parents and teachers to access. The weekly school bulletin allows learners to write reflections and share their experiences with a wider community. This documentation can be used as evidence of their service work and its impact.

Service as Action incorporates ATL skills that help students develop essential skills such as teamwork, problem-solving, communication, and social responsibility while also deepening their understanding of the real-world application of what they learn in the classroom. It fosters a sense of empathy and encourages a lifelong commitment to making a positive difference in the world.

There is dedicated class time for MYP 2-MYP5 learners to work on their Service as Action projects. Students could take action using the various avenues outlined in the poster attached.
