The emotional impact of a young child's death is multifaceted and highlights the interconnections of human relationships and the deep emotional bonds that tie communities together.


Please keep Lady Florence's family in your thoughts and prayers as they face the challenging days ahead.

Exeat

There are two types of exeats: general and medical.

All students will be allowed two exeats each mid-semester. Please plan accordingly to avoid disapointments.

All exeat requests must be completed online and submitted with at least 48 hours' notice, with the exception of urgent medical issues. Weekend exeat requests must be received by the preceding Wednesday. Any requests after this deadline will not be approved.

The integrity of an exeat request is critical.

No exeats will be granted if a student has outstanding work.

No exeats will be granted during the last week before a semester break.

Parents/Drivers must show the approval exeat from their phone to enter (NO SHOW. NO GO!).

Students must return by 5.00pm on Sundays (weekend exeats).



General Exeat

A general exeat will cover passport and visa matters, as well as family events. These must not exceed more than two per mid-semester.

Medical Exeat

A medical exeat will cover medical, dental, optical, and hospital appointments. When possible, appointments should be made for Saturdays, to minimise learning loss.

A medical exeat is for the same day departure and return. Otherwise, it is a general exeat. Requesting a medical exeat with a departure on Friday and a return on Sunday is a weekend (general) exeat.

Admissions 2024/2025

Admissions for the next academic year are now open for the secondary school, Grades 7-12.

- Priority for TIS family members ends on 1 December 2023.
- The first round of admissions will be completed by 30 November. The second round will commence in February.
- Prospective students are required to complete application forms online via https://tis.openapply.com
- An application fee can be paid via ExpressPay, at the school or into the school's account. The account details can be found on the Bank Details page.
- All prospective students will take an aptitude test that does not require special preparation. An interview would be conducted before a final decision is made. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the selection process.
- Only candidates who have fully completed the application form will be contacted for the aptitude test and subsequent interview.
- Prospective families are encouraged to *arrange a school tour before or during the application process*.
- Early applications and admissions are encouraged. Late applications will be considered if vacancies exist.
- Grades 7, 8 and 9 applicants will be required to provide three current term or two semester reports.
- Applicants for Grade 11 will be required to provide three current term or two semester reports, predicted grades and a recommendation letter. When final results are released, applicants must attach a scanned copy on OpenApply. The release of final results will confirm subject selection levels (Standard or Higher).
- After the completion of the Middle Years Programme (Grade 10), TIS students are expected to complete the IB Diploma Programme in Grades 11 and 12. They will make initial subject selection choices during the second semester of Grade 10. The release of examination results will confirm subject selection levels (Standard or Higher). Please note that students are generally not accepted into (Grades 10 and 12,







CAS-SA Corner Tema International School rocks National Theatre



Enduring value of performing arts

• Tema International School rocks National Theatre

From the outset to the dramatic finale - where Moses finally summoned the Red Sea to part to let his people go - I sat astounded at the National Theatre, Accra, witnessing a daring artistic rendition of the biblical story, The Prince of Egypt.

I'm a sucker for good theatrical creation and could hardly rein in the flow of emotional juices radiating from the feminine side of my male personality. It was mind blowing to discern the multi-disciplinary approach to the whole production: the media and design, set and props, music and dance, choreography, costume and make-up, stage design, lights and sound - were all directed by the teenage students.

The play offered a dazzling musical rendezvous enacted through storytelling, acrobatics, juggling, somersaults, choreography, and belly dancing. As noted by the TIS theatre teacher, Ebenezer Kwame Asime: "working with young, creative minds and nurturing their talents has always been a fulfilling experience." It took three good months of navigating and negotiating the production.

African images, voices

In the past, the dramatic interpretations of such biblical stories were produced by Hollywood studios with Eurocentric flavours, casting actors like Charlton Heston, Elizabeth Taylor, Richard Burton, etc. The African origins of the stories themselves were blocked from public spectre notwithstanding the historical reality that these were African stories from thousands of years past, but now craftily contextualised for imperial purposes.

Edward Said, the late professor at Columbia University, and iconic activist for Palestinian liberation, alluded in his book, "Culture and Imperialism," that the plagiarism of history produced a system of domination as worrying as cannons and soldiers.

In his book, 'Introduction to African Civilizations', the American Pan-Africanist historian, John G. Jackson, was to note that in the past years, explorers and archeologists have found "the valleys of the Niger, Benwezi, Limpopo and Nile Rivers, in the basin of Lake Chad and the Sahara, extensive remains of hundreds of ruins which bear witness to the existence of former civilizations, hundreds and thousands of years ago."

Knowledge of the African past revealed stories of triumphs and failures of mankind and form some key chapters in the history of human race, with many of the episodes and characters cast in biblical terms.

As providence would have it, the essence of the TIS production coincided with my previous column, "Time to own our African images, voices", [November 20, 2023], in which Lucy Quist lamented that "It is regrettable that our entire story is often limited to colonialism and independence. We seem to be unaware that we had great kingdoms before and great leaders who had organized their societies in remarkable ways". She urged all Africans not to let their narrative be stolen or replaced by negative ones.

Prompting that same awareness, the iconic African movie producer and cultural curator, Kwaw Ansah, noted, "All we are trying to do is to bring about African glory; to tell Africans to be themselves and rise to tell their own stories." Ansah's museum at Sekondi, Ghana, "Bisa Aberwa," was founded with a mission to showcase Africa's essential contributions to world civilization. Today, this task for fresh narratives emphasizes a most important growth area for legitimate historical inquiry and appreciation.

The Prince of Egypt

For TIS's 20th-anniversary production, the story of "The Prince of Egypt" was chosen to underscore the idea that the legacy of hope can endure across generations and that even "in the darkest of times, individuals and communities can find the strength to believe in a brighter future and work towards it."

The musical play demonstrates the enduring power of hope and its ability to inspire and uplift people, instilling a profound sense of optimism and faith in the human spirit, as demonstrated by the TIS founders Alphonse and Comfort Adjavon.

The principal, Dr Ken Darvall, noted that "In many schools worldwide, the mention of the annual school production usually sends everyone scurrying to find a darker corner in which to hide. Why? Because school performances are exhausting, stressful, time-consuming and a threat to one's comfort zone."

At TIS, he said, the opposite effect happens: "Students come out of the woodwork to try and snag a role within the school production, either onstage or backstage." The TIS experience involved everyone - the PYP, MYP, and DP students.

The student directors learned some valuable lessons in leadership, time management, and teamwork across the board. They noted that working with teams of talented individuals demanded adaptability and open-mindedness to others' opinions. Over many hours of designing, building, and painting, each crew enjoyed seeing their creative ideas come alive on stage.

Service learning projects

A most mature form of education happens through service learning where the youth explore their broad interests while growing their natural talents. The rewarding aspects are directly related to community projects where one's humanity and personal abilities are grown and highlighted through a key learning profile in what the International Baccalaureate (IB) curriculum defines as Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS).



#MYP – Avenues for Principled Actions

As shared in previous bulletins, Service as Action is a unique opportunity for students to take actions concerning issues within their immediate environments. It encourages students to connect what they learn in the classroom to real-world experiences and make a positive impact in their local community. It also provides students the chance to *Explore*, *Plan*, *Implement* and *Reflect* on their efforts to positively impact their local environment.

Exploration: Students begin by exploring various local issues or needs in their



community. This can involve research, discussions, and understanding the context of the issues they want to address. They may also identify their personal interests and skills that they can bring to their service projects.

Plan: After identifying a particular issue or need, students design a service project. This involves planning and brainstorming how they can contribute to addressing the issue. They set goals, outline tasks, and establish timelines for their projects.

Implementation: During the designated hour in class, students work on implementing their service projects. This may involve activities like volunteering, organising events, creating awareness campaigns, or other hands-on efforts to make a positive impact. They put their plans into action. This is where they make the connection explicit by using classroom content to address the explored or identified need.

Reflection: Reflection is a crucial part of the Service as Action component. Students regularly reflect on their experiences, what they've learned, and the impact of their efforts. It's common for students to document their *actions* & *service* experiences on their individual portfolios or worksheets on MB for both parents and teachers to access. The weekly school bulletin also provides an opportunity for learners to write their reflections and share their experiences with a wider community. This documentation can be used as evidence of their service work and its impact.

Service as Action incorporates ATL skills that help students develop essential skills such as teamwork, problem-solving, communication, and social responsibility while also deepening their understanding of the real-world application of what they learn in the classroom. It fosters a sense of empathy and encourages a lifelong commitment to making a positive difference in the world.

There is dedicated class time for MYP 2-MYP5 learners to work on their Service as Action projects. Students could take action using the various avenues outlined in the poster attached.





Open Book Exam pilot

DP Economics

Your school has been chosen to participate in a study looking into the impact of offering different types of open book exams on the whole school community. In this case your school will be piloting an OBE in the DP Economics paper 1 exam.

We would like to inform you on what this will mean for the students taking this exam at your school.

- 1. Students will be sitting the exact same paper but will be allowed to prepare and bring in a maximum of 2 A4 pages summarizing real-world examples that students may use in the exam.
- 2. Student summaries will be allowed to be either in the format of mind maps or short written summaries for each real-world example up to a maximum of 60 words per example and approximately 1200 words in total.
- 3. Students may use a combination of both mind-maps and written summaries.
- 4. Written or digital versions of their resources are allowed but written is recommended.
- 5. If students choose to write their resource, this must be legible.
- 6. Students must not include definitions of terminology, explanations of concepts and theories, nor any analysis or evaluation.
- 7. Students will not be allowed to include visuals including tables, figures, or diagrams.
- 8. Different colours will be allowed, as well as bullet points and acronyms.
- 9. Students will be allowed to include details of real-world examples not in their resource should they wish.
- 10. Student resources will need to be checked at least 1 month before the exam.

Checklist for DISTURBING CONTENT

Work out whether the content is right for your child.

It might be around their age or just their personality, but trust your gut and put boundaries in place.



Read up on the issues it explores. If you show that you are comfortable and knowledgeable with the issues it explores your kids are more likely to open up to you during a tough time.



Stay up to date with pop culture. You may not care about the Bieber's or Beyonce's of this world but following sites like Pedestrian.tv and news.com.au will help you

stay ahead of the game.



Make sure they know that not everything they see is how it appears. Have a frank conversation about not taking everything on the internet at face value.



Tell them that they don't have to watch something if they don't want to.

Brainstorm ways they can say no to their peers and feel confident making their own decisions.



Encourage them to practice self-care. If they are going to watch something make sure they've got an arsenal of things to pick them back up afterwards.



Offer to watch it with them. That way you can talk through anything tough as it comes up. This can be useful even if they've already seen the content.



Let them know where to go for help. Ask them who they would feel comfortable talking to and connect them with services like ReachOut or Kids Helpline.






- ✓ Revise. Look at past exam papers.
- ✓ Make a realistic revision schedule by finding a revision style that suits you.
- ✓ Customise your notes to make them more personal.
- ✓ Make sure you understand everything, but ask for help and prepare adequately!
- ✓ Take regular short breaks and physical activities help too!
- ✓ Reward yourself.
- ✓ Try a breathing exercise if you're feeling overwhelmed. Take a few minutes to read the instructions and questions.
- ✓ Plan how much time you'll need for each question.






