# Exeat

There are two types of exeats: general and medical.

All students will be allowed two exeats each mid-semester. Please plan accordingly to avoid disapointments.

All exeat requests must be completed online and submitted with at least 48 hours' notice, with the exception of urgent medical issues. Weekend exeat requests must be received by the preceeding Wednesday. Any requests after this deadline will not be approved.

The integrity of an exeat request is critical.

No exeats will be granted if a student has outstanding work.

No exeats will be granted during the last week before a semester break.

Parents/Drivers must show the approval exeat from their phone to enter (NO SHOW. NO GO!).

Students must return by 5.00pm on Sundays (weekend exeats).



# **General Exeat**

A general exeat will cover passport and visa matters, as well as family events. These must not exceed more than two per mid-semester.

# **Medical Exeat**



# **Admissions 2024/2025**

Admissions for the next academic year are now open for the secondary school, Grades 7-12.

Priority for TIS family members ended on 1 December 2023.

The first round of admissions has been completed. The second round will commence in February.

Prospective students are required to complete application forms online via <u>https://tis.openapply.com</u>

An application fee can be paid via ExpressPay, at the school or into the school's account. The account details can be found on the Bank Details page.

All prospective students will take an aptitude test that does not require special preparation. An interview would be conducted before a final decision is made. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the selection process.

Only candidates who have fully completed the application form will be contacted for the aptitude test and subsequent interview.

Prospective families must arrange a school tour before the admission test and interview.

Early applications and admissions are encouraged. Late applications will be considered if vacancies exist.

Grades 7, 8 and 9 applicants will be required to provide three current term or two semester reports.

Applicants for Grade 11 will be required to provide three current term or two semester reports, predicted grades and a recommendation letter. When final results are released, applicants must attach a scanned copy on OpenApply. The release of final results will confirm subject selection levels (Standard or Higher).

After the completion of the Middle Years Programme (Grade 10), TIS students are expected to complete the IB Diploma Programme in Grades 11 and 12. They will make initial subject selection choices during the second semester of Grade 10. The release of examination results will confirm subject selection levels (Standard or Higher). Please note that students are generally not accepted into (Grades 10 and 12,







# HOSTEL CORNER Health, Dress Code & Appearance Guidelines - A Gentle Reminder



Dear Parents,

Happy New Year. May this year be a fulfilling one for you and your family. Preparations are underway to receive yours as they return to the boarding house on Sunday, 14 January. Please take note of the following announcements.

#### Nose Masks

Our medical team has advised that all students wear nose masks for the first two weeks of the semester. This forms part of measures to reduce the spread of respiratory infections that may be brought from home. We kindly request parents get their wards enough nose

marks to cover the period. Students would be encouraged to wash their hands regularly and avoid touching their faces when they return to school.

#### Labelling for Easy Identification

We encourage students to label their belongings for easy identification. This small yet significant step prevents mix-ups and ensures that your child's items are readily distinguishable from others.

African Print Outfits for Church: Every first Sunday of the month, we celebrate our African heritage by encouraging students to wear African print outfits for the church service. We kindly remind all students and parents to prepare these special outfits for these occasions.

**Enforcement and Compliance:** Our dedicated school administration and staff, work diligently to consistently and impartially enforce our dress code requirements. These guidelines serve as the foundation for a respectful and appropriate atmosphere within our school. It is important for students to understand the significance of adhering to these guidelines, as non-compliance may result in warnings, parental notifications, and, if necessary, disciplinary action.

**Exeat Dress Code:** When students are leaving or returning to the school premises, it is imperative that they abide by our exeat dress code. This requires wearing the TIS polo shirt and school uniform, paired with sneakers or sandals. We want to emphasise that slide-style shoes, crocs, and slippers are not permissible.

### **Girl's Dress Code Guidelines**

- General Appearance: During the school day, students must maintain a tidy, clean, and decent appearance. For our female students, this includes neatly tied back and arranged hair.
- Hair Length: Girls should aim for hair at mid-back or shoulder length. Hair extensions should match their natural hair colour. Girls must adhere to these requirements to be asked to return home to make the necessary adjustments.
- **Clothing Guidelines:** Appropriate clothing should cover the torso, back, and belly adequately. Tank tops with wide straps are acceptable, while spaghetti straps are not. Crop tops are permitted when worn with appropriate undergarments.

- Skirt and Shorts Length: Skirts and shorts should extend no more than 2 inches above the knee. We encourage students to exercise good judgment and select clothing that reflects modesty.
- **Footwear:** All students should wear all-black shoes and socks to school. On Fridays, when the TIS Green Polo is donned, the footwear of choice should be full shoes and sneakers.
- Accessories: The use of excessive or distracting accessories is discouraged. Students are requested to refrain from wearing accessories such as sunglasses, jewellery, and hats while in school uniform. One pair of earrings is allowed when wearing school uniforms, and multiple pairs at the same time are not permitted.
- Head Coverings: Except for religious or medical reasons, students should avoid wearing hats, caps, or other head coverings within school premises. The exception to this rule is during sports events, and that is only for sporty hats.

# **Dress Code Guidelines for Boys**

- **Clothing Guidelines:** Boys are encouraged to wear casual clothes for various activities, including hostel duties, physical activities, beach outings, games, ASA, and school trips. For after-school activities, we recommend simple plain trousers or shorts in blue, brown, black, grey, khaki, paired with matching shirts. Special occasions call for smart outfits such dress shirts and trousers and appropriate footwear.
- Shoes: Boys are expected to have appropriate footwear (dress shoes, sandals, sports shoes and slippers) for various occasions, including formal, casual, and sports activities. Black shoes are required for school. In the event where students have to wear sandals for school and formal events, they must have straps.
- Hair Length: Boys must maintain a hair length of one inch (2.5cm) and ensure that their hair is neatly combed or brushed at all times. Boys are encouraged to come school with their own combs and hairbrushes. Boys with facial hair are advised to come to school with shaving cream and after-shave to reduce bumps after shaving.

We sincerely appreciate your cooperation in helping your child adhere to these guidelines. Together, we can maintain an environment that promotes respect, discipline, and our students' overall growth and development.

# **How Your Teenager Can Manage Distractions**

It's entirely normal for teens to get distracted from studying from time to time, especially during stressful exam periods or when they're struggling to understand the work. Plus, the transition to digital school work and having the internet right at our fingertips means that it's never been easier to be distracted.

Avoiding doing work or study is a widespread response to feeling overwhelmed and stressed, but while leaning into a bit of self-care to get through high-stress study periods is one thing, you don't want your teen perfecting the art of procrastination because it'll come back to bite them during exam time.

If your teenager is struggling to balance study with school work, social media and other daily distractions, there are ways you can help them help themselves.

### Set time aside for fun

After spending hours studying and working, it's to be expected that your teen might be feeling exhausted or stressed. While they may already have a study plan, please encourage them to have a fun plan, too. If they have a specific time set aside for relaxing, social media or gaming, they'll have less desire to distract themselves while working.

#### Take regular minibreaks

Suggest that they work in chunks of time – say, 20 minutes – then take a few minutes to get a drink, stretch and walk around. This will keep their energy, maintain their concentration and make their study more manageable. You might watch how they're going by having a cup of tea and a quick chat with them during one of these scheduled mini-breaks.

#### **Block screen alerts**

Encourage them to block the alerts if they're working on a tablet or computer linked to their messages or social media. When they're concentrating, a message alert pinging up will distract them and break their train of thought. They can go for it in their non-study time and catch up on social media.

### Agree on 'phone free' zones

Talk about areas of the house that can become temporary phone-free zones, such as where they study and where everyone eats together. Encourage the whole family to play a role in making it happen.

### Create a space they can concentrate in

This is especially important if your teen has to study in a common area with plenty of distractions, like the living room or kitchen. Being around a lot of noise and activity can significantly disrupt their study routine. Creating a space primarily dedicated to their study hours will help them focus and concentrate.

If you're unable to create a dedicated space, try to create a quiet environment where they're studying. Keep the TV turned down or off and avoid having lengthy conversations around them. If you have other kids, ask them to keep the noise down, so their sibling doesn't get distracted. Some people work best with silence, others with a hum of background noise or music. See what works for them.

#### **Minimise interruptions**

While they're studying, don't let anyone disturb them; leave it until they're having a break. Did you know that it takes most people around 20 minutes to get back on track with study after an interruption?

#### Monitor their sleep

Lack of sleep makes you lose focus, so it's easier to procrastinate or get distracted when you're tired. <u>Here's how you can help them get better sleep</u>. On the flip side, if your teen is studying from home, there may be a temptation to hit snooze on the alarm and lay around all day. Explain the importance of maintaining a routine like this, including when they wake up and go to bed. <u>They can learn more sleep routine tips here</u>.

#### Eat healthy, regular meals and snacks

Being hungry causes energy levels to drop and makes it hard to concentrate, so encourage your teen to eat proper meals and healthy energy snacks such as nuts. <u>Help them out by using these handy tips when cooking them food</u>. Sharing a meal with your teen is a good chance to check in on how their study is going. Even a break for a quick lunch before heading back to the books gives you a chance to ask how they're feeling and support their wellbeing.

#### Cut the caffeine

Encourage them to drink lots of tap water; being hydrated will help them concentrate. Long days at the desk may make them keen for coffee (and lots of it!). Remind them that <u>too much</u> <u>of a good thing can be bad</u>, and suggest alternatives: Herbal teas are an excellent calming substitute.

Exams, expectations and study loads can make your teenager stressed and easily distracted. Trying even a few of these tips can help you support them to manage teenage distractions, keep calm during exam periods and <u>study more efficiently</u>, which reduces their overall stress and improves their wellbeing.


