Visiting Protocols

For visits until 26 May 2024, parents will be required to book their visit online. Please go to: <https://www.schoolinterviews.com.au/code/hn8s8>

Complete your details and click *next* to select your day and time. Then click next to receive a confirmation of your booking.

If you do not receive confirmation of the date and time, then you have not completed your booking.

Weekend times will usually go from 2.00 - 5.00pm on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays Sessions are 60 minutes.

There are restrictions on food and/or drink may be consumed during a visit.

Book early to avoid disappointment.

Identification Labelling

Students are required to have their belongings appropriately labelled for identification purposes. Too many students are careless about leaving their belongings in the wrong place (not their lockers) and then not remembering where they left them. Often, items left around the school, especially power cables and chargers, are claimed by students who think an item belongs to them.

To assist students in the identification of lost and found items, parents are requested to ensure all items are clearly labelled when school resumes for second semester.
