



Exeat

There are two types of exeats: general and medical.

All students will be allowed two exeats each mid-semester. Please plan accordingly to avoid disapointments.

All exeat requests must be completed online and submitted with at least 48 hours' notice, with the exception of urgent medical issues. Weekend exeat requests must be received by the preceding Wednesday. Any requests after this deadline will not be approved.

The integrity of an exeat request is critical.

No exeats will be granted if a student has outstanding work.

No exeats will be granted during the last week before a semester break.

Parents/Drivers must show the approval exeat from their phone to enter (NO SHOW. NO GOI)

Students must return by 5.00pm on Sundays (weekend exeats).



General Exeat





FOSTERING AGENCY: EMPOWERING STUDENTS

What is agency?

Agency, in a general sense, refers to the capacity or ability of individuals or entities to act independently and make choices that influence their own lives or the world around them. It encompasses the idea of autonomy, self-determination, and the power to make decisions and take actions that have an impact.

Agency in IB education refers to the capacity of learners to take ownership of their learning process, make meaningful choices, and take actions that lead to desired outcomes. It is the ability to set goals, make decisions, and advocate for oneself within the learning environment.

Why is agency an essential aspect of a PYP education?

Agency is considered crucial in the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) for several reasons:

Inquiry-based learning: The PYP is centred on inquiry-based learning, where students explore questions and topics that are personally meaningful to them. Agency empowers students to take ownership of their learning by allowing them to ask questions, investigate their interests, and drive their inquiries.

Student-centered approach: The PYP strongly emphasises student agency to ensure learning experiences are tailored to each student's needs, interests, and abilities. The PYP promotes engagement, motivation, and deeper understanding by giving students a voice in their learning process.

Developing lifelong learners: By fostering agency, the PYP aims to develop students as lifelong learners who are capable of taking initiative, setting goals, and adapting to new challenges. This includes developing critical thinking, problem-solving, self-regulation, and reflection skills, which are essential for success in future academic endeavours and life beyond school.

Promoting active citizenship: The PYP is committed to developing students as active, responsible, and globally-minded citizens. Agency plays a key role in this process by empowering students to take action on issues that are important to them, both within their local communities and on a global scale.

Building self-confidence and self-efficacy: By allowing students to make choices, take risks, and experience the consequences of their actions in a supportive environment, agency helps to build self-confidence and self-efficacy. This, in turn, contributes to a positive sense of identity and a willingness to take on new challenges.

Overall, agency is considered essential in the IB PYP because it supports the program's goal of developing internationally-minded students who are empowered to make a positive difference in the world. By providing opportunities for students to exercise agency in their learning, the PYP aims to foster a lifelong love of learning and a sense of agency that extends far beyond the classroom.






Provocations/Setting goals/student questions: "A great way to begin a unit of inquiry."

Teachers present thought-provoking questions, scenarios, or real-world problems related to the unit's central idea to spark students' curiosity and interest in the unit. Students are encouraged to share their initial thoughts, ideas, and questions about the unit, fostering a sense of ownership and curiosity in their learning journey. Students are given opportunities to generate their own questions and areas of interest related to the unit, allowing them to take ownership of their learning and pursue learning goals that are personally meaningful to them.











These approaches empower students to take an active role in their learning process, encouraging curiosity, critical thinking, and engagement from the beginning of the unit of inquiry.

Agency informs teachers of future lesson plans by listening to students' interests and preferences, offering choices in learning activities, and personalising instruction to meet individual needs. Teachers encourage student-led inquiry and reflection, gathering feedback to tailor future lessons accordingly. By incorporating agency into lesson planning, teachers create engaging and relevant learning experiences that empower students to take ownership of their learning and succeed academically.

Agency during our inquiry journey

During our unit of inquiry, students' agency is promoted through various opportunities for choice and planning in their learning engagements. Students are encouraged to select topics that they are interested in. They also get to decide how to share their ideas with others, like making a presentation, through singing or acting out a scene. Additionally, students have a voice in the way they want to share their learning with the entire school community during the unit celebration.






Agency and Assessment

At Tema International School Primary School, agency is closely connected to assessment through student-led conferences or the three-way interview, choice in assessment methods, self-assessment and reflection, and student involvement in assessment criteria. Students take ownership of their learning journey through student-led conferences by showcasing their progress to their parents or guardians. Providing students with choices in assessment methods empowers them to demonstrate their understanding in ways that align with their strengths and preferences. Encouraging self-assessment and reflection enables students to take ownership of their learning, identify growth areas, and develop improvement strategies. Additionally, involving students in developing assessment criteria promotes transparency and accountability, fostering a culture of agency where students are actively engaged in their educational journey and motivated to succeed.

The PYP Exhibition and Agency

The PYP Exhibition and agency are closely connected as the exhibition provides students with a culminating opportunity to showcase their agency in action. The exhibition is the culmination of the Primary Years Programme (PYP) where students, typically in their final year of primary school, inquire into real-life issues or problems that are of personal interest to them. This inquiry-based project allows students to exercise agency by taking ownership of their learning, making meaningful choices about their research topics, and deciding how they will present their findings to others.



Try to **overcome procrastination**. Managing your time wisely will reduce stress-induced, last-minute work which increases the likelihood of cheating.




