This will be highly important for our exam candidates during the remainder of this semester.





# Exeat

There are two types of exeats: general and medical.

All students will be allowed two exeats each mid-semester. Please plan accordingly to avoid disapointments.

All exeat requests must be completed online and submitted with at least 48 hours' notice, with the exception of urgent medical issues. Weekend exeat requests must be received by the preceeding Wednesday. Any requests after this deadline will not be approved.

The integrity of an exeat request is critical.

No exeats will be granted if a student has outstanding work.

No exeats will be granted during the last week before a semester break.

Parents/Drivers must show the approval exeat from their phone to enter (NO SHOW. NO GOL)

Students must return by 5.00pm on Sundays (weekend exeats).



### **General Exeat**

A general exeat will cover passport and visa matters, as well as family events. These must not exceed more than two per mid-semester.

## **Medical Exeat**

A medical exeat will cover medical, dental, optical, and hospital appointments. When possible, appointments should be made for Saturdays, to minimise learning loss.

A medical exeat is for the same day departure and return. Otherwise, it is a general exeat. Requesting a medical exeat with a departure on Friday and a return on Sunday is a weekend (general) exeat.



# TIS Primary Musical Fiesta:

Celebrating the crescendo of authentic learning



On 22 March 2024, the Tema International School - Primary Years, held the audience spellbound for an entertaining couple of hours with the highly educational celebration of learning like no other. It was a musical masterpiece! The celebration was the summation of inquiries and learning to climax the fifth unit for all classes from the primary years and included some unforgettable contributions from the early years' ongoing units of inquiry.

For the benefit of those who would relish recounting the amazing tales told from these joyful lyrical lessons that Friday, as well as those who, by some unfortunate happenstance, missed this grand fiesta, here is the story retold with its proper context and intent. It was a melodrama titled "A Wonderful World" that captured every unit learned between nine classes in our TIS Primary School campus over the past five weeks.

Before its staging on Friday, the Primary School underwent rigorous rehearsals and collaborative planning meetings to assemble the pieces from each class. Guided by the team of teachers, the learners wove their ideas into a beautiful tapestry of a story that concerns our world, which was portrayed as a village of good and happy people.

The curtain-raiser was a gracious sign language dance to the popular tune by Louis Armstrong, "What a Wonderful World." This was the announcement for the theme of the celebration. It was followed by the Early Years students, who are learning about storytelling, sitting around the narrator as he sang the history of the wonderful village they call home.

The villagers assembled from all walks of life to dance cheerfully to some traditional tunes. Their sheer joy and vibrant moves depicted both contentment with their present life and their unsophisticated approach to livelihood. They did just enough for sustenance and subsistence, not exploring the vast wealth within their reach and not harming the environment with unbridled carelessness.

In this scene, the Grade 1 class sang about the various types of energy: light, sound, kinetic, electrical and more. They reminded each one how vital energy is to life's processes, hence the need to conserve energy as responsible people.

The next scene, played by Grade 3, focused on a mother in this village who was having a hard time reaching her daughter in the big city. In her primitive ways, she was still sending letters by post mail, using an analogue (yam) phone, and having no idea about the benefits of social media for her business. Upon hearing her distress, her beloved daughter gathers her friends to visit the village and educate her mother about the ways digital tools have changed communication, access to information and the technology for work.

Then comes a host of post-modernist business moguls; corporate giants from Grade 6, who are interested in the community for their diverse natural resources. They had come to negotiate to explore these resources at the cost of exploiting the natural environment to its destruction. The ensuing debate with the local elders was a beautiful melodic banter. Finally, a consensus has been reached: the sustainable use of natural resources in ways that biomes and natural habitats are duly preserved.

In the ensuing scene, the village king observed the tendency for anarchy and carefully contemplated how to govern his monarchy. His counsel, Grade 4, in a back-and-forth musical parliament, proposes divergent views for governance, from tyranny to democracy. The king wisely concluded that the people's voice must be heard and that they deserved the right to choose the form of governance that would protect and not enslave the villagers.

A chief and his people are confronted with dire water problems at the other end of the village. They have one source of water - a steam, which serves every purpose in the community. The villagers here, played by Grade 2, received visitors who educated them about safe and appropriate water use. They further sang about the properties of water and how these capabilities of water make it possible to purify it through filtration and other means. Based on their learning, they demonstrated how CPR should be performed in emergencies.

Grade 5 returned to chant about the good ways to work within the environment with sustainable practices. They displayed the classes of natural environments, singing their characteristics and the best ways to live should we find ourselves there.

The show was crowned as the songstress, Abena Sampong, Grade 3, led the school in singing the TIS rendition of Michael Jackson's "We Are the World." Then, the final curtains were drawn, with the pop band playing harmonious hi-life tunes from the 90s.

Do enjoy the scenes from both rehearsals and the celebration performances.




















































### Reflections




Also, at the celebration were invited guests from **the Aves International Academy**. Here are a few of their comments:
