“Preparing for the Transition: Lessons Learned from TIS to the World”

Reflecting on my six years in TIS and life after, I realise that five lessons have shaped the person I have become.

Lesson 1: Strive to be disciplined. As you head to university and adulthood, you will discover that freedom can be both a blessing and a curse. You are the decision maker. With freedom, you will find that nobody will question your decision to skip classes or engage in vices like substance abuse. Your self-restraint and ability to prioritise what is necessary, like your education, will guarantee success.

Lesson 2: Actions have consequences. You have been blessed with your parents, guardians and adults who pointed you in the right direction, and soon, these people will become passengers and let you take the wheel. The world will hold you accountable, and you owe it to yourself to think critically before acting. Weigh the outcome because each decision will have a result that you will have to live with or take further steps to change.

Lesson 3: Create Balance. To get the most out of your university experience, participate in academic and non-academic activities. Just like in TIS, you will meet people and form lifelong bonds that will only survive if you nurture them. Plan your time so you maintain a healthy social life while striving for academic excellence.

Lesson 4: Know Yourself. Remember who you are and where you come from. Keep an open mind, be willing to learn and unlearn because change is constant. Take time to study yourself and discover your purpose. University will expose you to numerous possibilities. Be intentional about staying true to yourself and your values.

Lesson 5: Failure is not a definition. You will have some highs and lows, but the world will not pity you during your lows. Think of failure as a moment to stop and reevaluate your plan. It might give you a new direction or deepen your resolve to try again. Tell yourself, “I just failed at this, but I am not a failure.” Pick out the lessons and keep moving.

Zonta Young Women in Public Affairs International Award Presented to Nissi Arday of Tema International School (IB Class of 2024) with Prestigious YWPA Award

Zonta International is a service organization with the mission of Building a Better World for Women and Girls. It has more than 27,000 members in 62 countries. These countries are grouped into 32 distinct districts and Ghana belongs to District 18.

Zonta has a number of awards, fellowships and scholarships, and the Young Women in Public Affairs, YWPA is one of such awards. The YWPA Award recognises young women, aged 16 to 19, for exhibiting leadership skills and commitment to public service and civic causes because Zonta International believes that young women are the key to women's advancement in the field of public service. The goal of this award programme is to encourage young women to participate in public affairs by recognising their dedication to the volunteer sector, leadership qualities, accomplishments, and commitment to empowering women worldwide through service and advocacy.

Nissi Arday, one of 11 candidates selected by the Zonta Club of Accra, was recognized by Zonta International for founding the NGO Spectrum Connect to combat autism stigma. She raised GHC 18,000 for a speech therapy block and increased autism awareness. Additionally, she raised GHC 10,000 for Operation Smile, funding surgeries for two children with cleft lip and palate. Her leadership in mentoring and coaching students has fostered the development of other young women leaders.

Nissi is one of 32 global award winners selected by Zonta International, receiving a USD 5000 award and a certificate. We hope this recognition inspires her to further her public and civic service efforts to create a better world.

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Celebrating Service at TIS: A Year of Impact and Commitment

Embracing Service as a Core Value

As Tema International School (TIS) commemorates its 20th anniversary, we reflect on a year marked by remarkable service initiatives that underscore our commitment to community engagement and global citizenship. At TIS, service is not just an activity but a fundamental principle embedded in our educational philosophy. Through the International Baccalaureate (IB) program, we nurture internationally-minded individuals who understand the importance of service in learning. This ethos is integrated into our curriculum through Service as Action, the Community Project, and CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service), fostering a comprehensive understanding of service learning. These components align perfectly with the IB philosophy and TIS's core values of transparency, excellence, and service.

Impactful Service Projects: Integrating SDGs and IB Principles

Akorlikope Community Project (2012 - 2019)

From 2012 to 2019, TIS students embarked on the Akorlikope Community Project, building a six-classroom block with essential facilities in a remote village in Ghana. This initiative enhanced the community's quality of life and aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of Quality Education, Sustainable Cities and Communities, and Clean Water and Sanitation. Students learned the importance of long-term commitment and the impact of educational infrastructure on community development.

Healthy Heart, Healthy Life CAS Project

In a testament to our commitment to collaboration, TIS students partnered with the Children's Heart Foundation, Ghana, for a CAS project. The aim was to provide support for surgeries for children with congenital heart diseases. Through their collective efforts, a staggering nine Thousand Dollars (US\$9,000) was raised to fund the open-heart surgery of young Benjamin. Benjamin's life was significantly transformed, allowing him to thrive and live an everyday life. This project was a shining example of our students' dedication to making a positive difference in their community.

Spectrum Connect (2024)

The Spectrum Connect initiative challenges misconceptions about Autism and promotes inclusivity. Partnering with HopeSetters Autism Centre, this project aligned with the SDGs of Good Health and Well-Being and Quality Education. Students learned about the importance of awareness and advocacy in creating inclusive societies.

Operation Smile (2024)

The IB Class of 2024 raised funds for surgeries for children with cleft conditions through a partnership with Operation Smile Ghana. This initiative supported the SDG of Good Health and Well-being. Students understood the transformative power of surgical interventions in improving quality of life.

United to Light Ghana (2016, 2019)

Students provided solar LED lights and power banks to communities without electricity. This project, which distributes 4,000 solar lights and 250 power banks, is aligned with the SDG of Affordable and Clean Energy. Participants learned about sustainable energy solutions and their impact on improving living conditions.

Project Phillipa (2023)

MYP 5 students raised funds for Phillipa Enti's burn treatment. This compassionate project aligned with the SDG of Good Health and Wellbeing. Students gained insights into the importance of healthcare access and the role of community support in recovery processes.

Eco Aid and Beacon of Hope (2024)

A group of students from the IB Class of 2024 embarked on a journey to contribute to their community significantly. They raised over GHC 50,000 to refurbish the Eco Hill boys' dormitory, supporting a home for special children. Their commitment to service extended to the Osuboi community, where they collaborated with the Hope Has Come Foundation, raised funds for the Easter Drive in 2023, and contributed to refurbishing the community centre. Their dedication to service is truly remarkable.

Live Young Love Old (2024)

Claire-Elise Addo, Dayna Sarpong, and Kristine Ayitey-Smith revamped an elderly care centre's kitchen, raising over GHC 40,000. This project aligned with the SDGs of Good Health and Well-Being, Decent Work, and Economic Growth. Participants understood the value of caring for the elderly and the importance of adequate facilities in enhancing their quality of life.

The Code Red (2024)

Veronica and Balma created reusable sanitary kits for girls from deprived communities. This initiative aligned with the SDGs of Good Health and Wellbeing and Quality Education. Students learned about menstrual health management and the significance of educational interventions in promoting gender equality.

The SaniFlush CAS Project (2023)

Focused on refurbishing washroom facilities at Ashaiman No. 2 JHS, students raised approximately GHC 31,000. This project addressed SDGs, including Good Health and Wellbeing, Quality Education, and Clean Water and Sanitation. Students developed skills in project management and the importance of sanitation in schools.

Transforming Lives - 20th Anniversary Service Project (2025)

Led by the IB Class of 2025, the school community raised GHC 103,000 for surgeries of infants with Anorectal Malformation and donated five monitors to the Korle-Bu Teaching Hospital Paediatric Centre. This project aligned with the SDG of Good Health and Well-being. Students experienced the impact of collective efforts in addressing critical health issues and improving medical infrastructure.

Community Outreach Initiatives

TIS students engage in various outreach efforts, including teaching, art workshops, construction projects, and donations in

locations such as St. Nicholas School and Calvary Presby School. These activities align with numerous SDGs, including No Poverty, Zero Hunger, and Gender Equality, embodying the IB's emphasis on service learning.
