
Devices







Essential Agreements are prominently displayed, guiding students on expectations for class management, including play areas, dining spaces, and general classroom conduct. Physical, Social, and Personal Education (PSPE) displays provide visual cues and reminders of key concepts. The attributes of the Learner Profile are showcased through interactive displays, allowing students to reflect on and connect with these essential traits. 





Essential elements of the PYP







All six elements are clearly displayed in each learning environment. The elements are Knowledge, Concepts, Skills, Attitudes, Action and the Learner Profile attributes



IBDP SUBJECT SELECTION

The IBDP curriculum consists of six subject groups and the three elements of the DP core: theory of knowledge (TOK), extended essay (EE), and creativity, activity, service (CAS). These are the subject groups:

GROUP	DESCRIPTION
1	Studies in Language and Literature
2	Language Acquisition
3	Individuals and societies
4	Sciences
5	Mathematics
6	The Arts

There are two main pathways students can follow for admission into universities:


1. Diploma


Students subscribe to the full balanced curriculum by selecting six (6) subjects: 3 at higher level (HL) and the other 3 at standard level (SL). It is possible to select 4 subjects at HL and 2 at SL. The student must offer TOK, EE and CAS as well. A subject must be selected from each group (except group 6 where students may decide to rather select an additional subject from group 3 or 4).

2. Diploma courses

The students must select at least 3 subjects in all including at least one at HL. It is compulsory to select a subject each from Group 1 and 5. We advise the selection of 5 subjects.

The tables below show the subject blocks that are available in Tema International School. A diploma student must select a subject from each block and ensure each group from 1 to 5 is represented.

Welcome Back to School

Dear Continuing Students, we are excited to have you back in school this Sunday. Our Newbies have reported and are settling in comfortably. They cannot wait to see you all.

Nose Masks and other health requirements

Students are to come to school with nose masks (2 weeks' supply), vitamin C and pocket tissue. Students are encouraged to wash their hands regularly and avoid touching their faces when they return to school.

Labelling for Easy Identification

We encourage students to label their belongings for easy identification.

Dress Code for return to school

Students are reminded to wear their school uniforms or TIS polo with appropriate footwear. Slide-style shoes, crocs, and slippers are not be worn when returning to school.

Girl's Dress Code Guidelines

- General Appearance: During the school day, students are required to maintain a tidy, clean, and decent appearance. For our female students, this includes neatly tied back and arranged hair
- Hair Length: Girls should aim for hair at mid-back or shoulder length. Hair extensions should match their natural hair colour. Girls not adhering to these requirements will be asked to return home to make the necessary adjustments.
- Clothing Guidelines: Appropriate clothing should cover the torso, back, and belly adequately. Tank tops with wide straps are acceptable, while spaghetti straps are not. Crop tops are permitted when worn with appropriate undergarments.

- **Skirt and Shorts Length:** Skirts and shorts should extend no more than 2 inches above the knee. We encourage students to exercise good judgment and select clothing that reflects modesty.
- **Footwear:** All students should wear all-black shoes and socks to school. On Fridays, when the TIS Green Polo is donned, the footwear of choice should be full shoes and sneakers.
- Accessories: The use of excessive or distracting accessories is discouraged. Students are requested to refrain from wearing accessories such as sunglasses, jewellery, and hats while in school uniform. One pair of earrings is allowed when wearing school uniforms, and multiple pairs at the same time are not permitted.
- **Head Coverings:** Except for religious or medical reasons, students should avoid wearing hats, caps, or other head coverings within school premises. The exception to this rule is during sports events, and that is only for sporty hats.

Dress Code Guidelines for Boys

- Clothing Guidelines: Boys are encouraged to wear casual clothes for various activities, including hostel duties, physical activities, beach outings, games, ASA, and school trips. For after-school activities, we recommend simple plain trousers or shorts in blue, brown, black, grey, khaki, paired with matching shirts. Special occasions call for smart outfits such dress shirts and trousers and appropriate footwear.
- **Shoes:** Boys are expected to have appropriate footwear (dress shoes, sandals, sports shoes and slippers) for various occasions, including formal, casual, and sports activities. Black shoes are required for school. In the event where students have to wear sandals for school and formal events, they must have straps.
- **Hair Length:** Boys must maintain a hair length of one inch (2.5cm) and ensure that their hair is neatly combed or brushed at all times. Boys are encouraged to come school with their own combs and hairbrushes. Boys with facial hair are advised to come to school with shaving cream and after-shave to reduce bumps after shaving.

Enforcement and Compliance

Our dedicated school administration and staff, work diligently to consistently and impartially enforce our dress code requirements. These guidelines serve as the foundation for a respectful and appropriate atmosphere within our school. It is important for students to understand the significance of adhering to these guidelines, as non-compliance may result in warnings, parental notifications, and, if necessary, disciplinary action.




