

We are proud that TIS continues to excel in the wholesome combination of Academics, Arts, Sports, Culture, Leadership, and Service to the community.


At the core of this feat is that wonderful blend of grit, effort, preparation and commitment of our able management, teaching and support staff, students, and parents.

The villagers noticed that on some days in the week, she was exceptionally slow in walking, with the bucket on the head, so all the children would go past her on the road.

Many children and villagers looked at her and made fun of her with her slow walk.

One day, an old lady asked her: "why do you walk so slowly on selected days when even children who are younger than you go past you?"

The young lady replied: "They are always carrying water in their buckets. However, I sometimes carry eggs which my mother sells for income in our family. If they walk fast and spill water, that is no great loss. However, if I go fast and break the eggs, that would mean loss of investment and possible starvation for our family."

The moral lesson is simple. Please think carefully and deeply before you carry out any task. I thank you for your kind attention.

Besides his weekly column, Education Matters (Daily Graphic, Ghana), he's the author of: "LEADERSHIP: Reflections on Some Movers, Shakers and Thinkers" which he used to teach Leadership Seminars at Ashesi University; "MFANTSIPIM: The Makers of a Great School"; and three, "Strategies for Effective Teaching and Learning".

He started off professionally in the U.S. with the Los Angeles Unified School District, and later, coordinated a Gifted And Talented Education (GATE) program.

In Ghana, he has served as Chairman, National Teaching Council (NTC) and a board member of the Ghana Education Service (GES). He's an advisor of the Otumfuo Millenium Excellence Foundation, and Senior Lecturer, Accra College of Medicine.

He is a product of Mfantsipim School, Cape Coast; California State University, Los Angeles; and California State Polytechnic University, Pomona. **Dr. Sylvia Awo Mansah Boye**, a renowned Educationist, was born in Keta. She attended Wesley Girls High School (1952-1956) and Mfantsipim School (1957-1958), both in Cape Coast. She furthered her education at the University College of Ghana (1959-1962).

Dr. Boye had a distinguished 37-year career with the West African Examinations Council (WAEC). She broke glass ceilings, becoming the first female Head of the Ghana National Office (1989-1995) and later the first female Registrar of WAEC (1995-2000).

Her achievements extend to education leadership, as she was the inaugural Chairperson of the Board of Governors for Tema International School, where she is still helping in the running of the school as a Member of the current Board.

Dr. Sylvia Boye's contributions have been recognized nationally and internationally. Notably, she was awarded the Order of the Volta (MV) in Ghana and the Grande Dame of the Order of the Star of Africa (GDOSA) in Liberia.



Alumni Speaker's Profile

Dr. Abdul Aziz Timbilla is an outstanding alumnus of Tema International School, where he began his journey of academic excellence in 2009 and graduated in 2015. His time at TIS laid the foundation for a remarkable path in medicine, research, and education.

In 2015, he was accepted into Charles University, Faculty of Medicine in Hradec Králové, Czechia—one of Europe's oldest and most respected medical schools—where he earned his medical degree in 2021. His commitment to advancing medical science and patient care led him to the

Mayo Clinic in Rochester, USA, in 2023 for a prestigious research internship. In 2024, he broadened his clinical insight through an observership in Emergency Medicine at Mater Misericordiae University Hospital in Dublin, Ireland.

Currently, he is pursuing a Ph.D. with a focus on anticancer drug development, in collaboration with the Department of Biochemistry. His research is dedicated to exploring novel compounds and mechanisms aimed at improving cancer therapy. He is also a member of the European OncoPharm Research Team—an interdisciplinary association committed to enhancing the efficacy of oncological pharmacotherapy by addressing drug resistance, minimizing toxicity, and paving the way for personalized cancer treatment.

Beyond research, Dr. Timbilla is a dedicated biochemistry tutor, actively shaping the minds of future medical professionals with clarity and passion. His clinical qualifications include certifications in Basic Life Support (BLS), Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS), and Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS). He is also a registered member of the Irish Medical Council.

His contributions to science and academia have been recognized with several honors, including the Excellence in Science Award (2024) from Fund F at Charles University and second place for Best Lecture in Experimental Research at the 21st International Medical Doctoral Conference.

He has also authored and co-authored impactful scientific publications in leading journals, contributing to the global discourse on science and innovative cancer therapies:

Well done on achieving this amazing milestone! Today marks the conclusion of years of hard work, resilience, and determination. As you step forward into the next chapter of your lives, know that you carry with you the spirit of Tema International School, a spirit of excellence, curiosity, and growth.

Reflecting on my own journey, I remember the anticipation and excitement that came with graduating from TIS. The IB programme challenged me in ways I never imagined, but it also prepared me for the trials of medical school and beyond. The late-night study sessions, the intense debates and discussions in MUN conferences, the collaborative projects and CAS activities, the experience of being a prefect, and even the moments of self-doubt encountered during my time at TIS all contributed to shaping me into who I am today.

These experiences taught me that learning does not end in the classroom, that failure is not the opposite of success but a part of it, and that our greatest growth often comes from stepping outside our comfort zones. Another lesson I carry with me is the importance of remaining curious and open. Never stop learning. Graduation is not the end, but a transition into another stage of discovery and development. Be open to growth, challenge your perspectives, and embrace the journey of lifelong learning.

Just as important as learning is how we choose to live. Discipline and integrity are everything. I still recall being awarded Best-Behaved Student in Grade 12, which affirmed for me that character matters just as much as achievement. Stay true to your values, these will anchor you in every season of life.

And lastly, I must say this: take care of yourself. Ambition matters, but so does balance. As a medical doctor, I've seen how neglecting our mental and physical wellbeing can have lasting effects. Your health is your greatest asset, protect it. In the decade since my own graduation in 2015, I have navigated the path from university to becoming a medical doctor, and now, as I prepare to acquire my Ph.D., I recognise how vital those early lessons were. They taught me the value of discipline, the importance of collaboration, and the necessity of perseverance. Life will present challenges, but trust in your roots and the foundation you have built here at TIS. You are more prepared than you realise.

As you move forward, my advice to you is this: Stay curious, stay resilient, and stay kind. Chase your dreams with unwavering determination, but never forget to uplift those around you. Success is not measured solely by personal achievement but by the impact you make in the lives of others.

The future is bright, and it belongs to those who dare to innovate, adapt, and lead with purpose. You are "The Innovators," and I have no doubt that you will go on to shape a better world.



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


