

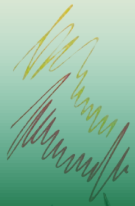

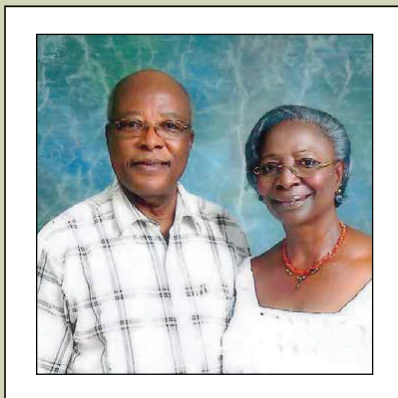

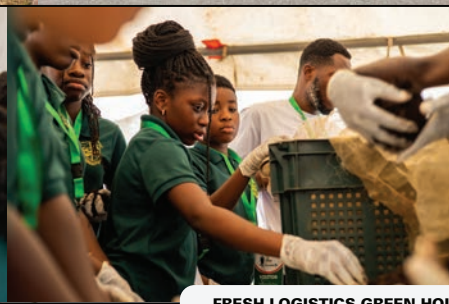

ADJAVON YOUNG LEADERS IMMERSION PROGRAMME

The TIS Giving Back Programme was born in March 2024, during a deeply significant moment in the history of Tema International School (TIS): the 10th anniversary of the passing of the late TIS Co-Founder, Mr Alphonse A. Adjavon.

As the TIS community reflected on the vision, values, and legacy of the Co-Founders, Mr Alphonse Adjavon and Mrs Comfort Adjavon, the Founding Family began exploring meaningful ways to honour the two visionaries; not only through remembrance, but through action, impact, and opportunity.

At the centre of these conversations was a simple but powerful question:

How can the transformative spirit of the TIS experience extend beyond the school's walls?

One of the earliest catalysts for these conversations came through ideas shared by Mr. Seth Adu-Baah, TIS Parent and active member of the school community, who passionately encouraged the exploration of immersive learning and exposure opportunities for brilliant young people beyond the immediate TIS student body. His contributions helped to further expand the scope of the discussions and illuminate

what would eventually become the foundation of the TIS Giving Back Programme.

For over two decades, Tema International School has nurtured young people through leadership, creativity, service, global mindedness, experiential learning, and community engagement. Over time, a growing desire emerged to share aspects of this experience with brilliant and promising young people who may otherwise never have access to such opportunities.

These conversations gradually gave birth to the TIS Giving Back Programme – an initiative rooted in service, educational access, mentorship, exposure, and youth empowerment.

The vision for the programme continued to evolve through conversations, planning, and collaboration involving the Founding Family, the Board of Governors, Dr Ken Darvall (former Principal of TIS), Mrs Surama King (CAS & Events Coordinator), Mr Seth Adu-Baah (TIS Parent and active member of the TIS community), and Apiorakor Seyiram Ashong-Abbey (TIS Alumna, IBDP 2007).

The programme has also been shaped by years of CAS projects, Service as Action initiatives, outreach programmes,

experiential learning, and partnerships forged by TIS students and staff across different communities and schools.

From these interactions emerged the desire to create a practical and immersive initiative capable of bringing the vision of TIS Giving Back to life, in a direct and meaningful way.

Out of this vision, the Adjavon Young Leaders Immersion Programme (AYLIP) emerged as a flagship initiative of the TIS Giving Back Programme.

Designed as a fully-sponsored five-day residential immersion experience, the maiden edition of AYLIP welcomes thirty (30) selected students from partner schools into the TIS environment for leadership development, mentorship, creativity, innovation, sustainability, public speaking, wellbeing, and experiential learning opportunities.

Following the launch of AYLIP, staff, alumni, students, parents, organisations, and friends of the TIS community began actively supporting the initiative through volunteering, mentorship, sponsorship, partnerships, and programme development.

At its heart, AYLIP is grounded in the belief that the future of Ghana and Africa will be shaped by young people who are confident, compassionate, creative, globally aware, and deeply connected to their communities.

As Tema International School approaches its 25th Anniversary in 2028, it is hoped that the future Adjavon Foundation shall become a sustainable platform, through which students from these communities may one day access scholarship opportunities to study at TIS at the IB Diploma Programme level.

Today, the TIS Giving Back Programme and AYLIP stand as a continuation of the Adjavons' legacy: a legacy rooted in education, service, opportunity, community, and the enduring belief that when young people are given access, mentorship, exposure, and belief, lives and futures can change.
