Message from Principal Yvonne-Marie Tagoe (Misty)

In our **Academics** this year, we have continued to manage the ever-present Artificial Intelligence (AI) that is affecting authentic learning globally. In true TIS fashion, we have navigated our way around this problem and gingerly put AI where we want it to be (as an assistant, not a replacement) for our learning. From MYP2 to DP2, students' Approaches to Learning (ATLs) and our culture of integrity have made this possible. DP students worked to produce authentic presentations in the Theory of Knowledge (ToK) exhibitions. They backed up their well thought out theories with profound and original arguments. Our MYP students proved by engaging us in excellent discussions during their exhibitions in the Community and Personal Projects , that it was also possible to uphold integrity and work alongside AI without compromising and replacing authenticity.

Every year at Tema International School (TIS), we build on an aspect of the legacy left to us. It takes a strong legacy to open up a world of possibilities for surviving generations. Ours has been to develop young learners holistically and make them world-ready leaders through our ever-present **Four Pillars - Academics, Culture, Sport and Service**. We salute the Class of 2026 (The Vanguarders) for completing their journey through TIS.

Two characteristics have strengthened the building of our legacy through our four pillars; **tenacity** and **integrity**. At TIS, we do not give up, even in the face of challenges or setbacks – that is **Tenacity**. We uphold the desire to do the right thing always - that is **Integrity**.

The **Culture** of learning to play a musical instrument and performing live may seem unnecessary when one can pre-program a music synthesizer. Yet, this has not prevented many students this year from playing instruments with a view to performing live with no failsafe mechanisms. **MYP5 musicians** supported the DP Genesis band at the Candidates' service. **MYP3 musicians** (some of whom came from PYP6) are already confident performers as we saw during our Christmas Concert. Our choir performed beautifully at the school's Anniversary thanksgiving service and at the Christmas Concert. Our **female saxophonists, Nylah DP2 and Mildred MYP5**, performed with finesse and creativity. To support all performances, students took ownership and leadership in directing the acting, building props for Grip Am! our annual school production and composing music.

When our students made presentations, performed or answered examination questions, they experienced the end-product of a specific journey through TIS. Their main tools for that journey were their ATLs and the development of tenacity. The most obvious place to look for and find **tenacity** would be in our Academics and Culture. When our Expression and STEM fairs came together to create our first

STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) fair, our students did not give up at the first sign of difficulty. They practiced, experimented, went back to the drawing board until they could present to us a successful and enjoyable STEAM fair in the presence of our guest speaker Professor Fred McBagonluri (Scientist/Artist). STEAM raised over 15,000 cedis in student enterprises.

Tenacity and strong leadership opportunities have brought about success in planning, funding and the creation of some of the most enviable service projects this academic year. Our MYP Community and DP Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS) projects offered service learning that was second to none in terms of recipient approval at the handing over of the projects and the quality of authentic learning to match this. The projects were student-led. Some of our major service achievements and projects this year were:

- GHS 16,000 raised - Bright Future (Community Project) – MYP project in Ashaiman to support Zenu No. 1 & 2 Cluster of Schools
- GHS 40,000 raised - Spectrum Kiosk (Community Project) – MYP project supporting HopeSetters Autism Centre

DP CAS projects

- GHS 86,500 raised – Saving Hearts Initiative
- GHS 74,270 raised – Healthy Heart, Healthy Life CAS Project
- GHS 11,000 raised – Operation Smile
- 1,000 Solar LED Lights distributed – Unite to Light Ghana
- Mante School of Excellence: IT Lab refurbishment and solar-powered toilet facility built.

It has not all been deskwork here at TIS. Our sports After School Activities (ASAs) allowed every student some healthy physical activity. ASAs also prepared students for Inter-House Colour activities in athletics, football, volleyball, handball, tennis, badminton and squash. These events nurtured strong sportsmanship and leadership skills and prepared the way for our Inter-Schools' Competitions. We took part in two-way Inter-School friendly matches with Association International School (AIS) in swimming, basketball and volleyball.

As the only international IB school to do so this year, TIS also presented the 3rd largest number of gold award students in Ghana at the Duke of Edinburgh International Award Scheme (Dukies') ceremony hosted by His excellency, the President of the Republic of Ghana, John Dramani Mahama. Our Dukies pushed through their chosen challenges in ASAs and outdoor expeditions to achieve their Gold Awards.

We proudly celebrate the successes of this academic year. Our class of 2026 and all award winners have each had a personal best in one form or another. I applaud all award winners for their achievements. To the graduating class, I say, though you are stepping into a future of unknowns, you have developed the best skills possible here at TIS and you will know what to do with them when the time comes.

Message

The Most Powerful Thing in the Room Is You

You are the Vanguard, the IB Class of 2026.

You have been trained to think critically, to explore globally, and to perform at an international standard. That foundation is real, and it matters. But today, as you step across this threshold, I want to add something to everything you have already been given. Something your textbooks may not have named but that your life will demand.

There is a conversation happening in boardrooms, classrooms, and government chambers across the world right now. It is urgent, it is real, and it is coming for every industry your generation will step into.

Artificial intelligence is not coming. It is already here. And yet, in the middle of all this technology, all this speed, all this disruption, the most future-proof thing on this planet is not a machine. It is not an algorithm. It is not even a qualification.

It is a human being who knows who they are.

Research from Harvard tells us that 85% of career success is driven not by technical knowledge, but by people skills, the ability to communicate with authenticity, to lead with empathy, to build genuine trust, and to make others feel truly seen. These are not soft skills. These are power skills. And in a world where AI can out-process any human being, your humanity is what will make you irreplaceable.

But here is what I want you to hold close, even more deeply. Those skills are not built in a vacuum. They are built on identity. They are built on knowing where you come from, what you stand for, and who you are when no one is watching.

The theme of your graduation is ***“Building on Legacy: A Future of Possibilities.”*** I want you to hear both halves of that sentence with equal weight.

Building on legacy means you do not erase where you come from in order to become who you are going to be. Your Ghanaian identity, your African story, your family’s love and sacrifice, your school’s twenty years of history, these are not things to leave behind. They are your foundation. And the taller you intend to build, the deeper that foundation must go.

A future of possibilities means the world is genuinely open to you, more open than it has ever been. But possibility without rootedness is just noise. Know your values. Know your voice. Know what you will not compromise, no matter how loud the world gets.

You are entering a world that will constantly ask you to perform, to compete, to prove. And you will rise to that. But I want you to carry something deeper than ambition into every room you enter. Carry your story. Carry your humanity. Carry the quiet, unshakeable knowledge of who you are.

Because in this new world, the most powerful person in any room will not simply be the most qualified. It will be the one who is deeply, unapologetically, and intelligently human.

That is your edge.

Protect it. Develop it. Lead with it.

Congratulations, Class of 2026. The world is ready for you, and far more importantly, you are ready for the world.

One of the highlights of the year was the HOSA Awards Ceremony, held at the University of Professional Studies, Accra, on 31 March 2026. Tema International School proudly celebrated **26 Gold Award recipients**, the third highest number among the 53 participating schools and institutions.

The Dukies Programme at Tema International School (TIS), based on the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award, continues to provide students with meaningful opportunities for personal growth, resilience, leadership, and skill development through experiential learning.

This academic year, students participated in three major Dukies activities: the Gold Awards Ceremony, the Bronze and Silver Expeditions with Kupanda Expeditions, and the Gold Expedition with Bravehearts Expeditions. These experiences challenged participants to step beyond their comfort zones, develop confidence, strengthen teamwork, and build essential life skills for an ever-changing world.

We were also honoured to receive recognition in the **Special Awards category**. This award acknowledges outstanding commitment to supporting young people across the four sections of the Award: **Voluntary Service, Physical Recreation, Skills, and Adventurous Journey**. Sujan Allotey IB Class of 2026

Over the past few months, one sentence somehow became part of our daily conversations: "This is our last..." Our last assembly. Our last prep. Our last lunch together. At first, we laughed every time someone said it. We said it so often that it almost became a joke. But somewhere between saying it and living it, it stopped feeling funny. Because suddenly, today is no longer one of our "lasts." It is our goodbye.

Our cherished *Founding Family*, *Major General Lawrence Gbetanu*, *Chief of Army Staff and Guest of Honour*, *Madam Dzigbordi Kwaku-Dosoo*, *Guest Speaker*, *Mr Seth Adu-Baah*, *Parent Advisor*, *Dr (Med) Nana Kwame Brown*, *Alumni Speaker*, *Principal, Management and Staff*, our dear *parents*, *invited guests*, *ladies and gentlemen*, *all protocols observed*. My name is **Sujan Allotey**, and I am deeply honoured to stand before you today as the Class Speaker of the **Tema International School IB Class of 2026 – The Vanguard**s.

For many of us, leaving TIS doesn't feel real. Somewhere between classrooms, deadlines, assemblies, sports events, service projects, and memories we did not realise we were making, TIS stopped being just a school and became home. Today, I do not stand here alone. I stand on behalf of **46 unforgettable people**. We were athletes, artists, leaders, dreamers, comedians, food lovers, and personalities so different that somehow it all worked. We were loud, funny, competitive, creative, and occasionally chaotic. Yet through it all, we remained close. The hostels became part of our story, a place where we grew up together through late-night conversations, laughter, friendship, and shared experiences. Perhaps that is why saying goodbye feels so difficult. We are not simply leaving classrooms behind; we are leaving a life we built together.

We would love to stand here and say the DP was easy, but then there were the IAs, CAS, TOK, the Extended Essay, university applications, and of course, Math. There were moments when deadlines felt impossible and moments when we looked at one another and said, "We are cooked." Yet when we look back now, we do not remember the stress first. We remember gathering before exams to pray together, encouraging one another, and reminding each other that none of us had to carry the pressure alone. That is who the Vanguards have always been. We showed up for one another always.

One of our proudest legacies is the impact we made through **our EducAid CAS Project at Mante School of Excellence**. Together, we helped build a toilet facility, provide solar lighting, establish a fully furnished ICT laboratory with computers and internet access, and create opportunities that will continue to serve students for years to come. We are deeply grateful to **our parents, especially Mr Francis Gavor, Mr Seth Adu-Baah, Chef Ruby Paintsil, Mrs Gloria Anin, and the TIS Community**, as well as everyone who supported this vision. We would also like to extend our heartfelt appreciation to **Dr Ken Darvall**, whose generosity played a significant role in making this project possible. Through the sale of his book, he dedicated all proceeds to supporting the **EducAid Initiative**, helping turn our vision into reality.

Yet while we left our footprint at Mante, Mante also left its footprint on us. We visited so often that the teachers there eventually began calling us "Sukuu Wura" for those who don't understand that means "school owner." It was a light-hearted nickname, but it reflected something meaningful: the time, commitment, and relationships we built with that community. Mante taught us that service is not charity; it is partnership, responsibility, and humanity. Wherever life takes us next, we carry with us a commitment to make a difference and leave every place better than we found it.

Of course, not every memory was serious. There were Physics and Business classes filled with laughter, debates that somehow started over nothing, and teachers who made us laugh without even trying. The truth is that we spend so much time waiting for the big moments that we forget to notice the small ones. Yet one day, the things we thought were ordinary become the things we miss most.

So today, we say goodbye. Goodbye to **Auntie Setor**, reminding us to tie our hair. Goodbye to **Mr Akortah**, reminding us to shave. Goodbye to siesta. Goodbye to the routines we complained about but secretly got used to. Goodbye to seeing each other every day. And goodbye to a place that quietly became home. We came here as students, but we leave as people shaped by friendship, challenges, service, laughter, resilience, and each other. We leave as **The Vanguard**s.

Thank you, Tema International School. Thank you, Class of 2026. Thank you to everyone who has been part of our journey.

ADJAVON YOUNG LEADERS IMMERSION PROGRAMME (AYLIP)

The **TIS Giving Back Programme** was born in **March 2024**, during a deeply significant moment in the history of Tema International School (TIS): the **10th anniversary of the passing of the late TIS Co-Founder, Mr Alphonse A. Adjavon**.

As the TIS community reflected on the vision, values, and legacy of the **Co-Founders, Mr Alphonse Adjavon and Mrs Comfort Adjavon**, the Founding Family began exploring meaningful ways to honour the two visionaries; not only through remembrance, but through action, impact, and opportunity.

At the centre of these conversations was a simple but powerful question:

How can the transformative spirit of the TIS experience extend beyond the school's walls?

One of the earliest catalysts for these conversations came through ideas shared by **Mr. Seth Adu-Baah**, TIS Parent and active member of the school community, who passionately encouraged the exploration of immersive learning and exposure opportunities for brilliant young people beyond the immediate TIS student body. His contributions helped to further expand the scope of the discussions and illuminate what would eventually become the foundation of the *TIS Giving Back Programme*.

For over two decades, Tema International School has nurtured young people through leadership, creativity, service, global mindedness, experiential learning, and community engagement. Over time, a growing desire emerged to share aspects of this experience with brilliant and promising young people who may otherwise never have access to such opportunities.

These conversations gradually gave birth to the **TIS Giving Back Programme** – an initiative rooted in service, educational access, mentorship, exposure, and youth empowerment.

The vision for the programme continued to evolve through conversations, planning, and collaboration involving the **Founding Family, the Board of Governors, Dr Ken Darvall (former Principal of TIS), Mrs Surama King (CAS & Events Coordinator), Mr Seth Adu-Baah (TIS Parent and active member of the TIS community), and Apiorkor Seyiram Ashong-Abbey (TIS Alumna, IBDP 2007)**.

The programme has also been shaped by years of CAS projects, Service as Action initiatives, outreach programmes, experiential learning, and partnerships forged by TIS students and staff across different communities and schools.

From these interactions emerged the desire to create a practical and immersive initiative capable of bringing the vision of **TIS Giving Back** to life, in a direct and meaningful way.

Following the launch of **AYLIP**, staff, alumni, students, parents, organisations, and friends of the TIS community began actively supporting the initiative through volunteering, mentorship, sponsorship, partnerships, and programme development.

At its heart, **AYLIP** is grounded in the belief that the future of Ghana and Africa will be shaped by young people who are confident, compassionate, creative, globally aware, and deeply connected to their communities.
